The UK-China Oncology Congress will be held in Beijing (25 – 26th June) and Guangzhou (28th June) this year.

The British Embassy Beijing and British Consulate Guangzhou are partnering with the China National Cancer Centre (supported by the China National Health and Family Planning Committee) to unite the scientific, medical and commercial cancer communities in the UK and China to move forward attempts to reduce the global cancer burden. The aim of the congress is to advance collaboration and partnerships in the field of cancer research and treatment, and to drive export growth through showcasing the UK's excellence in oncology related services, devices and therapies. We anticipate an audience of approximately 600 Chinese clinicians, researchers, oncology organisations, commercial buyers, and commercial companies seeking products and partnership opportunities.

The congress will take place over two days in Beijing (25 – 26th June) and one day in Guangzhou (28th June). The Beijing Congress will be split into two days. Day One focussing predominantly on policy, healthcare and clinical approaches to cancer; Day Two will focus predominantly on the science of cancer therapeutics, pharmaceuticals and new innovations. The Guangzhou Congress will combine healthcare, policy and science together in one lively conference. To compliment the seminars in both cities we will have an exhibition of UK excellence in oncology featuring around 60 UK companies covering each aspect of the patient journey from diagnosis to palliative care, and the journey of scientific discovery to patient.

The Congress has strong UK government support. It was announced by Department of Health Minister Lord O'Shaughnessy in December 2017 at the China UK People to People dialogue. Secretary of State for International Trade Dr Liam Fox also highlighted its importance when he accompanied the Prime Minister to Beijing in January this year. We anticipate a senior government figure will open the event.
