Day 1: Sat, Apr 21 2018 - Edinburgh

Day 2: Sun, Apr 22 2018 - Edinburgh

After breakfast you will be taken on a private tour of the city in the company of a driver-guide and private vehicle. You'll have the opportunity to visit some of the most outstanding attractions including Edinburgh Castle, at the top of the Royal Mile, Holyrood house, the Queen's official home when she visits Edinburgh (subject to closure when Her Majesty is in residence). You will also visit one of the National Galleries as well as the beautiful Royal Botanic Gardens. There are optional visits to Hopetoun House, situated just outside Edinburgh, and the Scottish National Archives where you may like to investigate your family history. Entrance fees to Edinburgh Castle and Holyrood house included.

Edinburgh Castle is Scotland's most famous tourist attraction and has dominated its surroundings with majesty for centuries. Historically, the castle has withstood numerous attacks from Oliver Cromwell's Roundheads in 1650, and William and Mary's army in 1689. The buildings within the fortress include a 12th-century chapel (Edinburgh's oldest building) and the Great Hall, completed in 1511. The castle is home to the National War Museum of Scotland, hosts the Edinburgh Military Tattoo every August and is still an active army base. Learn more about the history and stories that make this ancient place so amazing at your leisure.

Entrance ticket to Holyrood Palace.

The Palace of Holyroodhouse, the official residence in Scotland of Her Majesty The Queen, stands at the end of Edinburgh's Royal Mile against the spectacular backdrop of Arthur's Seat. This fine baroque palace is closely associated with Scotland's rich history.

Day 3: Mon, Apr 23 2018 - Edinburgh, St. Andrews

Depart Edinburgh, heading straight to Stirling Castle. Stirling Castle is a great symbol of Scottish independence and a source of enduring national pride. The castle's long, turbulent history is associated with great figures from Scotland's past, such as William Wallace, Robert the Bruce and Mary Queen of Scots. Situated on the east coast, close to St Andrews, there are a vast variety of attractions and facilities on offer. Travel through the quaint fishing villages of the East Neuk and you travel back through time. The traditional cottages with red pantile roofs and crow-stepped gable ends appear unchanged from earlier times. Fishing boats lie at rest in the harbour following the bustle of unloading their catch as they have done for centuries. Crail, Anstruther, Pittenweem, St Monans, Largo, and Elie... place names as picturesque as the villages themselves. It is not just the villages that give the East Neuk its appeal; the shoreline of the Firth of Forth is dotted with some of the finest beaches in Britain and some of the most spectacular links golf courses.

Day 4: Tue, Apr 24 2018 - St. Andrews, Aberdeen

Crossing the "silvery River Tay" through Dundee on onwards, you first visit of the day could be Glamis Castle, ancestral home of the Earls of Strathmore for over 600 years. The present Earl is Michael, 18th Earl of Strathmore and Kinghorne. Glamis is a living, breathing monument to Scottish hospitality; a place of enjoyment, reflection, laughter and wonder for all. The castle has witnessed more than 600 years of history and locals take great delight in sharing the many stories, secrets and intriguing tales that surround it. Continue to Aberdeen with a stop at Dunottar Castle in Stonehaven. The impressive ruins of Dunnotar Castle sit on the cliff tops looking out over the North Sea. There is plenty to explore in the extensive buildings including barracks, lodgings, stables and storehouses. The oldest part of the castle is the chapel which dates back to the mid-14th century. William Wallace, Mary Queen of Scots, the Marquis of Montrose and the future King Charles II are some of the notable names who have visited the castle. The castle also played host to Hollywood star Mel Gibson for the filming of Hamlet.

Day 5: Wed, Apr 25 2018 - Aberdeen, Inverness

Departing the “Granite City” your journey across country takes you to the Spey Valley. This area is famous for distilleries and as you are going to Ilay it would be an ideal opportunity to try some out and see what the differences are. These are just a few you can visit - Glenfiddich, Speyside Cooperage, Strathisla, Aberlour, Macallan. As you near Inverness why not stop at Cawdor Castle. A magical name, romantically linked by Shakespeare with Macbeth. A superb fairy-tale Castle, and just what every visitor is looking for ... Scottish history that you can touch and see and sense for yourself. Cawdor Castle is not another cold monument, but a splendid house and the home of the Cawdor family to this day. Cawdor Castle dates from the late 14th century and was built as a private fortress by the Thanes of Cawdor. The ancient medieval tower was built around the legendary holly-tree.

Day 6: Thu, Apr 26 2018 - Inverness

The Isle of Skye welcomes you on a private tour with a driver-guide to experience its dramatic mountain scenery and picturesque seascapes. On this wonderful tour, you will experience the very best of the Magical Isle. You will make your way through the Black Isle to Garve and onwards passing by the lonely village of Achnasheen and down through picturesque Glen Carron towards romantic Eilean Donan Castle, with time to visit this most romantic of Scottish Castles. Your tour then continues via Kyle of Lochalsh where you cross "over the sea to Skye" by way of the road bridge and head for Broadford and the road to Armadale, travelling through Sleat, known as the garden of Skye. Take the stunning Ord -Tarskavaig loop road into the hills for spectacular views overlooking the Sound of Sleat with the small port of Mallaig in the distance. Experience the rural charm of Sleat often meeting up with some of the local characters, namely sheep and cattle on the road! The Ord-Tarskavaig loop road travels across the centre of Sleat, where at every turn you see something to take your breath away. Take in some of the finest scenery in Skye, walk a sandy beach or explore the ruins of a long deserted castle. You will head for Ord, Tokavaig and Tarskavaig, passing the pristine Brae Ord forest, before reaching Loch Meodal and the first view from afar of the magnificent Cuillin Ridge and Blaven, the Blue Mountain. Watch out for golden eagles in the skies above before reaching the sandy beach in Ord, the ideal place to launch a kayak or search through countless rockpools. Cross over the Ord River and pass Tokavaig before the road descends to the rocky shore. Close by is Dunscaith Castle, scene of many ancient feuds between the clans, now just visited by seabirds, sheep and the occasional visitors. Enjoy superb views across the loch to the majesty of the Cuillins, and if you are lucky you may see an otter playing in the crystal clear waters. Drive on a few miles to Tarskavaig, a small township of white-painted cottages and its now deserted ancient church nestling above a rocky cove. Be sure to stop by the Communities Hall and enjoy the magnificent views or browse works of art at the Blue Studio nearby. Continue on to Gilleann Beach, great for beach combing, with its stunning views across to Rum and Canna. Head inland and pass through rolling hills and wild moorlands, ancient forests, bounded by lochs and streams, before arriving back at the main road at Ostaig. Energized and inspired by the beauty of nature, you will return to the Skye Bridge, heading for the mainland. As you cross, look out for the little island of Eilean Ban, where Gavin Maxwell, the author of the "Ring of Bright Water" lived for a while. You will return to Inverness via scenic Loch Duich, the Five Sisters of Kintail Mountains and Glen Moriston before reaching the famous shores of Loch Ness and stopping for photographs by the loch side - keep a careful look out, just in case you know who makes an appearance!

Optional Activity.

The curving bay of the Dornoch Firth and its magnificent white broad beaches are backed by a narrow strip of softly contoured dune land rising in two distinctive levels, providing just enough room for parallel fairways. The ridges, hillocks, dunes and undulating links land have all the characters of the best of links courses, and most of the difficulties.

The first eight holes follow the ridge and the remaining ten holes played in the opposite direction are bounded, except the 17th and 18th on the left by the sandy beaches of the firth. The par of 70 is evenly distributed over the two halves each having two par threes, a par five and six par fours. If the wind blows the course will demand more from the player especially the par four finishing hole where a par can be considered a birdie. Old Tom Morris was the architect responsible for extending the original 9 holes layout to 18 holes in 1886. He introduced the plateau greens which are the soul of the course, their uniqueness lies in their size and their inverted saucer shapes.
