Student Tuition: \$1757

- Includes all program logistics and planning, instruction and educational materials, round-trip airfare from Atlanta, quality hotel accommodations, 3 meals per day, entrance fees, coach bus and Metro transportation in-town, 24-hour supervision including night monitors at hotel, group photo, certificate, Close Up souvenir, secondary health and liability insurance coverage and specialized access to Georgetown Medical Center.

Instruction:

- Program instructors: Students spend the day with college-educated program instructors who have received over 100 hours of training in experiential education and Close Up methodology.
- Instructors are trained in First Aid, CPR and use of external defibrillators.

Safety and Security:

- Students on our Washington programs are supervised 24-7 by our trained staff.
- Night monitors are at the hotel from 9 p.m.-6:30 a.m. They make sure students are in their rooms at room check and stay on each student floor throughout the night.
- Every hotel has a health tech and through our partnership with Georgetown University Children's Medical Center students have 24-7 specialized access to the city's best medical care.
