Respite Clubs

Respite clubs are designed to be a socially stimulating time for participants and a much-needed break for caregivers! Increasing social awareness, encouraging relationship building and navigating our community are all basic foundations of these programs. Life and self-care skills are additional components of our program for older participants. We have a 1:2-3 staff: participant ratio for these programs. Personal 1:1 support workers are welcomed once they complete a background check. This program is covered by LISS funding. Interested? Contact brenda@worldforautism.org

- "Our World Our Time"-Ages 3-13 years- meets the 4th Saturday of every month except May, August and November (no respite) and December, where we meet on the 3rd Saturday. **Cost- \$50 and \$25 for siblings (an activity charge may be additional depending on the community navigation offering)**
- "Our World Explorers"- Ages 14 years to 24years- meets the 2nd Saturday of every month except May, August and November (no respite) and December, where we meet on the 1st Saturdays. **Cost- \$50 and \$25 for siblings (an activity charge may be additional depending on the community navigation offering)**

Workshops will generally be held on the 3rd Saturday of every month from 1-3 pm. Childcare is available on a 1st come 1st serve basis for a nominal charge of \$15 in our dedicated classrooms.

Recurring Workshops: A basic understanding of Autism Spectrum Disorder and Special Education is essential to your parenting journey. As a result, OWCA will provide Spring, Summer and Fall offerings of the following two workshops.

- **Autism 101 for Caregivers and Family members-** a transparent overview of autism, its impact on the family and necessary steps that caregivers and families must take on their journey of caring for a loved one with ASD. Participants will participate in interactive learning activities and leave with a tangible guide for supporting their child and family!

Presenter: Abila Tazanu, M.D. is a pediatrician, mother of three children with autism, founder and executive director of the One World Center for Autism. She has greater than 20 years of experience caring for children with special needs.

- **GPS for Special Education- A caregiver's guide-** a practical and candid overview of the special education system and Individualized Educational Plans. As a caregiver, a basic understanding of your child's educational supports and how to advocate for them is critical! Participants will need to bring their child's IEP to personalize this educational offering.

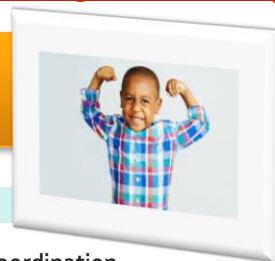

Siblings are often overlooked when it comes to family support, but they need an emotionally safe space to express their emotions about being a sibling to a child or youth on the autism spectrum. This year OWCA will spotlight our siblings at our **Spring and Fall SIBZONE retreats**. Sibs 6 years and older will participate in an all-day retreat led by adult and teen special needs siblings. Together they will learn about autism, use creative media to express their emotions and celebrate what makes them unique! At the conclusion of this activity, they will know that they are not alone and have new friends in their journey. Let's Move is Back!

Strength | Stability | Motor Planning | Coordination

Our family friendly fitness and wellness program is back! This year we are pleased to continue our partnership with **Salieu Sarr of SMS Fitness**, as we encourage greater movement through fun filled activities that promote health and social awareness! OWCA will offer Winter, Spring, Summer and Fall sessions of this program. Pre and post measurement of weight, height and BMI are a standard part of this program and provides accountability for participants and caregivers! A more comprehensive special need pre and post Health and Fitness consultations by Dr. Abila Tazanu are also available at caregiver's request this year and can be billed through participants' health insurance. **Fitness program cost for an 8-week session is \$220. Classes occur on Mondays and Wednesdays for a total of 16 classes in each session. Winter Session January 29th-March 21st. This program is covered by LISS funding.** Times will be dependent upon enrollment numbers and ages of participants. Ages 6 and above are welcomed! Interested? Contact samuel@worldforautism.org

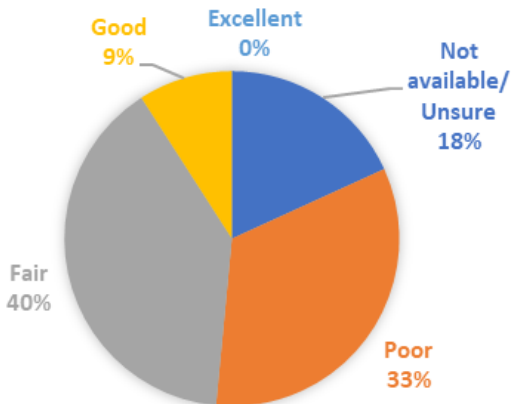


Future Offerings

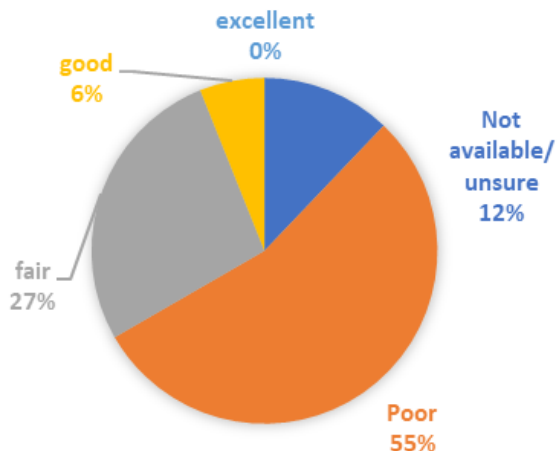

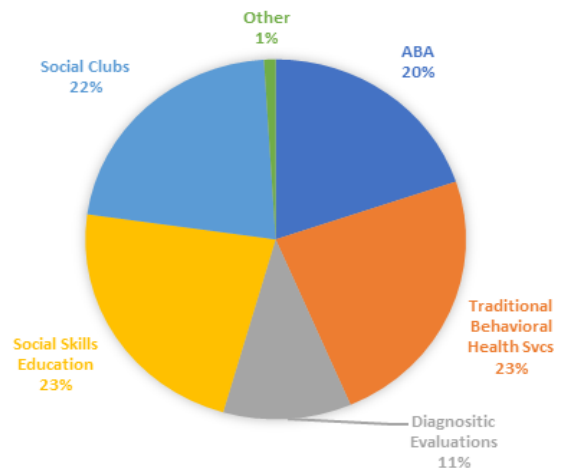

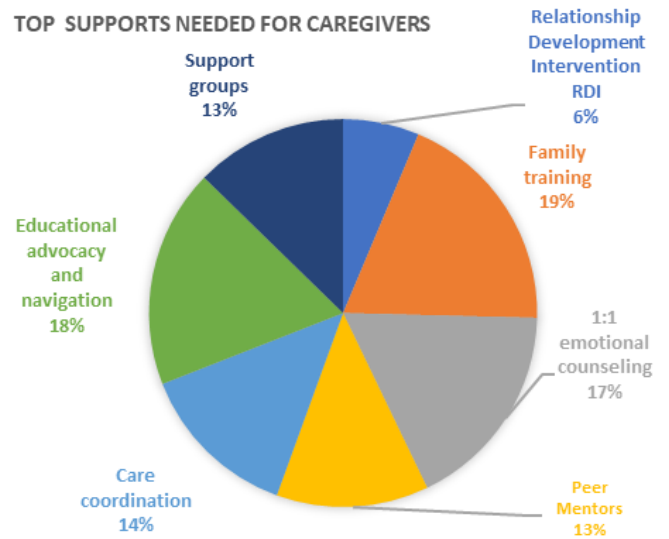
AVAILABILITY OF EMOTIONAL SUPPORTS FOR CAREGIVERS AND FAMILIES LIVING WITH AUTISM

In response to these needs, we are seeking to planning the following future programs to implement in 2018:

SOAR Behavior Enrichment Program

SOAR stands for Seeking Opportunities to Acquire Resilience and resilience is key to navigating one's world with autism. We are so pleased to partner with Dr. Henry Tarrazo, Ph.D. an experienced special educator with his post-graduate certificate in Applied behavior analysis to create and implement this program. SOAR will be based on our current model of family guidance; however, it will specifically identify behaviors that are a significant barrier to a child's, youth's or young adult's daily functioning by both an educational professional who applies the principles of Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) and a physician consultant with expertise in the care of children with autism and their mental health needs. Once behaviors are identified, a family-centered Behavior Enrichment Plan will be created, implemented and monitored by both professionals. Medication management may also be a part of this plan, if deemed necessary through family/professional partnership. Stay tuned!

We are excited to begin the discussion with **Dr. Juanita Pughsley**, veteran special- needs mother, former instructor of our RISE transitional youth and adult classes and occupational therapist with more than 30 years of experience; as well as, **Behavioral & Educational Solutions (BES)**, one of the premier providers of psychological and behavioral services in the Washington metropolitan area that will lead to the creation of life and social skills groups!
