He was the Director in charge of climate change when Japan ratified the Kyoto Protocol in 2002. From 2003 to 2006, he was the Director in charge of multilateral development institutions, including the World Bank, the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Development Assistance Committee at the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). Mr. Okaniwa received a BA in Law at Hitotsubashi University, Japan, and a BA in Modern History from Merton College, Oxford University, England.
