On June 24-26, Hmong Catholic adult, young adult, and youth leaders from across the United States convened at St. Bernard Church in Appleton, Wisconsin to partake in the annual Hmong American National Catholic Association (HANCA) leadership training. The 135 participants traveled from as far west as Fresno, California and as far east as Charlotte, North Carolina to join the event. Centered on Revelations 21:5 “Behold, I am

A special update was provided by Xia Vue Yang, of Hmong Catholic Ministry Center in America, on the beatification process of Hmong catechist Paul Xiong (Thoj Xyooj) and 16 other martyrs of Laos. Paul Xiong will be the first Hmong person beatified by the Church. The Beatification is set for December 10 and 11, 2016 in Vientiane, Laos. A thanksgiving Mass for the martyrs will be celebrated on June 17, 2017 at the National Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows in Belleville, Illinois.
