

The Census Bureau's estimate for the total U.S. population on April 1, 2010, was 308,745,538. The Census mid-year 2013 estimate of the population was 316,252,750.¹⁵ Thus, the U.S. population is estimated to have grown by 2.4 percent or 7,507,212 from April 1, 2010 to July 15, 2013. There are no available estimates at this time that would allow one to gauge how much of this growth occurred among any racial, ethnic, or national sub-group. The estimated 2013 figures in the table below are calculated by inflating the 2010 counts by the overall population growth percentage.
