### LEED V4 HALF-DAY TRAINING: THE INTERSECTION OF COLLABORATION, PERFORMANCE & WELL-BEING

This half-day workshop on LEED v4 will focus on the importance of three key areas: collaboration, performance, and well-being. Lynn will also share a brief history of green building and an overview of new sustainability certification rating systems, such as WELL.
