The Economic Development Authority of Western Nevada (EDAWN) maintains a list of primary companies in the region (companies whose revenue is primarily generated from outside the State of Nevada) in the fields of manufacturing, logistics, technology, back office support and others. This Excel spreadsheet can be downloaded at <http://edawn.org/existing-business/primary-company-list/> and provides a good overview of many of the primary companies in Washoe County, Storey County and portions of Lyon County. It is sortable by industry and provides information on the type of business and location.
