Last month, Presiding Bishop Michael Curry addressed a group in the Diocese of Maryland. At this gathering the Presiding Bishop stated (with echoes of Billy Sunday) "Heaven help the devil if the Episcopal Church ever wakes up. Wake up, Episcopal Church. That's what the Jesus Movement is all about." Bishop Curry, accepted as one of the most powerful preachers in the contemporary Episcopal church, is calling all of us to awaken our faith in God and our action for the gospel in a way that we have not been awakened before – or at least not for quite a while.

Throughout the history of Christianity, there have been times when we needed to wake up. I'm reminded of the letters to the seven churches in Revelation. John the Revelator writes to the Church in Laodicea a message from the one "who holds the seven stars in his right hand, who walks among the seven golden lampstands: [. . .] "I know your works; you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either cold or hot. So because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I'm about to spit you out of my mouth" (Revelation 2:1; 3:15-16). Challenging imagery, but the point is clear: wake up! Be something! Be the Kingdom of God come near; be the body of Christ.

In the coming months, you're going to be hearing more and more about exploring what God wishes Ware Church to do for the Spread of the Kingdom. I invite you to devote a portion of your daily prayers in June asking God's guidance for the mission and ministry of Ware Church. As we strengthen our individual spiritual life, we will only strengthen our communal spiritual life, and by doing so, "heaven help the devil".

I also invite your prayers as I introduce our summer intern, Seminarian Darren Steadman. Darren joins us on May 31 and will be here for 10 weeks. Darren will be serving a dual internship with us and Abingdon. Please welcome Darren to our family. Here's a short introduction from Darren:

I am excited to work in Gloucester this summer with both Abingdon and Ware Churches! I just finished my second year at Virginia Theological Seminary (where all the finest priests are formed) and next year will be my third and final leading to ordination next summer. My call and formation began by working at Shrine Mont summer camps, then as a classroom teacher and youth minister in Richmond, VA. I have always loved playing my guitar, hiking, sports, games and all forms of playfulness. More recently, I love preaching and teaching about living into Christian wholeness. As I continually pursue my ordained ministry, I hope and trust that God will lead me to many varied opportunities. I have enjoyed serving as a chaplain in summer camp and nursing home settings, as well as ministering to parishes. I am open to many ministry opportunities, and I pray they all include music, education, story-telling and laughter. I am so blessed to share the Christian journey with you all this summer. We are about to engage in a discussion. The Ware Church Discernment Steering Committee will begin the work of creating a Long Range Plan for the parish, a process in which *everyone* will have a voice in hearing God's call to us. In keeping with Ware's tradition of providing clean water to our community, we have named this process "*Gathering at the Well: Discovering God's Call to Ware Church.*"

We will likely discover much about ourselves. In the near-term, it will seem that we have recently experienced a similar examination. During our most recent search for a new rector, many responded to questions; those responses helped shape our Parish Profile.

Of note, our upcoming discernment process differs from the Parish Profile in two significant ways. First, parishioners will not be asked to respond to questions. *The input for this process comes directly from our congregation; they will shape the outcome. Second, it is not enough to publish a document that outlines God's plan for us...we must act on that plan and use it to achieve the work God is calling us to perform.*

From within our membership, we have formed five sub-committees: *Worship, Education & Spiritual Formation, Fellowship & Communications, Outreach and Stewardship*

How will we engage our congregation in this discussion?

Subcommittees represent a cross section of the church membership, with a special emphasis on the involvement of younger families.

The subcommittees collect input from the congregation employing numerous methods, to include Adult Forum, coffee hour meetings, regular meetings of church groups, and special sessions scheduled by the subcommittees.

What will we do with all of this input received from our congregation?

The discernment process should result in establishing the church's current strengths and weaknesses: how do we build on our strengths, and how do we address our weaknesses?

We intend to publish our results by early November 2017.

What happens after we receive the report?

The report will include near-term and long-term goals to carry out God's call to our congregation. In some cases, the goal might be accomplished by including some changes to our routine or ministries. In other cases, we may find that structural changes need to be made or added to our buildings in order to accomplish the goals established through this discernment process.

What can we do to support the process?

Pray, participate, and be patient. Listen to others. Share your own aspirations for Ware Church.

"Go forth into the world in peace; be of good courage; hold fast that which is good; render to no one evil for evil; strengthen the fainthearted ; support the weak; help the afflicted; honor everyone; love and serve the Lord, rejoicing in the power of the Holy Spirit"



We welcome **Darren Steadman** as our intern this summer. He is serving through the Mid-Atlantic Parish Training (MAPT) Program, which is designed to prepare future priests from the Diocese of Virginia for ministry by offering them the opportunity to serve in a parish on a full-time basis for a summer. The goal of MAPT is to immerse the intern in the life of a congregation, preparing him to enter into a faith community as a priest, providing learning opportunities through mentoring and collegial relationships, and offering opportunities to reflect on the summer experience through the lens of the ordination liturgy for the priesthood. Did You Know....

- The floor of the church used to be flagstones laid directly on the ground, interspersed with gravestones for parishioners buried within the walls of the church. In 1854, wood floors level with the pew floors replaced the flagstone aisles.
- The pulpit used to be a high pulpit near the south door but was replaced in 1854 by the modern one we see today within the chancel. About the same time, the area under the gallery was walled off.

As we celebrate Pentecost this year, we will be taking a few moments to recognize those who give of their time and talents in the Music Ministry. WARE RECIPES

Summer Time Favorites

Blue Cheese Burgers

Fresh Ground Round (I allow 1/3 pound per burger)	Two TBL of liquid Hickory Smoke
Fresh crumbled Blue Cheese (1 cup, or more!)	Olive Oil for grilling, Butter for the rolls
Pretzel Rolls, and any 'fixins you like to put on a burger	

+++++

In a large bowl mix the beef and the Hickory Smoke with your hands. Make sure the smoke flavoring is blended with the meat. Gently put in the crumbled Blue Cheese a little at a time, mixing with your hands. When the mixture is evenly distributed, form good size patties and place them in the refrigerator for twenty minutes. (This will help keep their consistency on the grill)

When your grill has achieved the right grilling temperature, (not TOO hot!), brush the burgers liberally with olive oil and grill to your favorite amount of "doneness". I was told by a professional chef not to keep flipping the burgers as that will dry them out. You should flip them once when you see juices coming up through the top of the burger, and give them a shorter time on the grill once they are flipped. They should be "springy" to the touch.

Spread the butter on the pretzel rolls and lightly grill them face down for a few minutes, being careful not to burn them.

Assemble the burgers and enjoy!


Will's Grilled Chicken

2 lbs chicken breasts, trimmed	1/4 c apple cider vinegar
3 tbsp. butter(melted)	1 tbsp. olive oil
2 tbsp. lemon juice	2 tbsp. lime juice
1/3 c dark brown sugar	1/4 c white sugar
1 tsp salt	2 tsp pepper
1 tbsp Dijon mustard	1 tbsp. ground mustard

+++++

In a large bowl or tin tray, combine the vinegar, melted butter, olive oil, spices, lemon and lime juices, sugars, and mustards. Place chicken breast in bowl or tray, and cover with marinade. Marinate for at least 4 hours minimum; overnight is best. Preheat the grill to roughly 350 degrees F. Place chicken, in tin tray or directly on grill. Cook 8-10 minutes per side. Serve with your favorite pasta salad dish.
