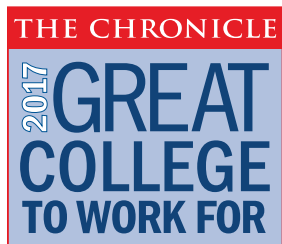

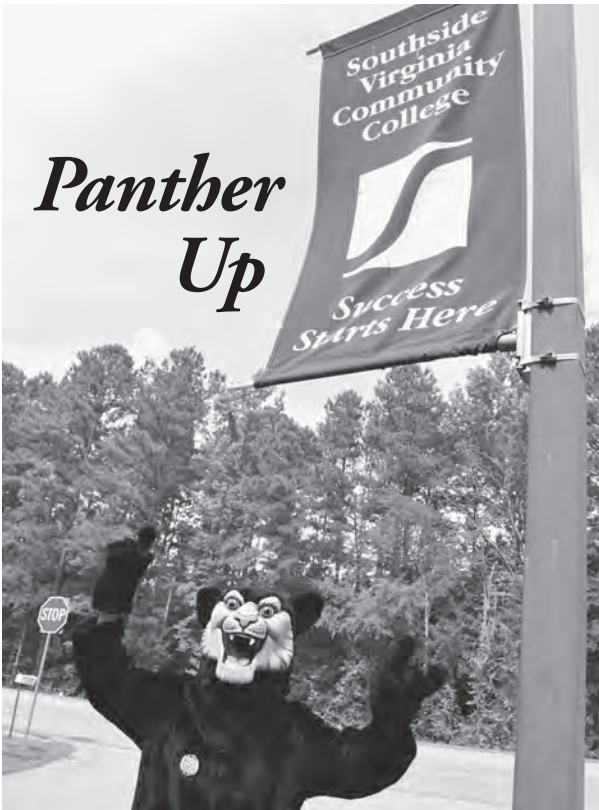

## Assessing the Value of Education

Every year as the summer turns its focus toward the coming of autumn, back-to-school stories tend to proliferate in national and local media. One recurring theme seems to be the rising cost of college tuition and questions about its value and payback.

To be sure, college costs have risen, and they continue to rise. The Center on Budget and Policy Priorities, a nonpartisan research and policy institute, released a report last year that documented the ways in which recession-related budgetary concerns led to cuts in the support of higher education. In 46 states, including Virginia, government spending per student continues to remain less than what it was prior to the beginning of the recession in 2008. In fact, based on inflation-adjusted dollars, funding for higher education in Virginia is now 22.5 percent less per student. Such reductions in support are one of the factors that contribute to rising tuition. In this fiscal climate, evaluating the return on investments in higher education seems fitting.

Some benefits fall outside the realm of dollars. College graduates tend to be healthier, more engaged in their communities, and better able to



understand diverse points of view. In most assessments, however, the question of value revolves around expenditures and paybacks.

In Virginia, community colleges offer a lower-cost, value-based choice. According to information from the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia (SCHEV), tuition and mandatory fees for full-time, in-state undergraduates in the Commonwealth's four-year colleges averages \$12,137. With fees of \$9,989 for room and board, that yields a grand total of \$22,126 per academic year. By comparison, here at Southside Virginia Community College in-state tuition and fees add up to \$4,582.50 for 15 credit hours per semester for the entire 2017-18 academic year. Furthermore, 94 percent of beginning undergraduate students receive significant financial aid packages.

But what's the payback?

College Measures, an initiative of the American Institutes for Research, studied that question. They found that students who graduate from a community college with an Associate's degree in an occupational or technical field earn an average of \$35,718

in the first year after graduation and \$41,879 eight years after graduation. At VA.EdPays.org on-line you can download the entire report or interactively explore the data to learn more details about wage variations by field of study and region. Additionally, students who earn an Associate's degree in a transfer program can save approximately \$35,000 on the cost of obtaining a Bachelor's degree. They also have an opportunity to establish their academic competitiveness and get a clearer picture of their overall career goals.

# Center for Information Technology Excellence To Open

This fall marks the opening of the Center for Information Technology Excellence (CITE) to prepare students for exciting careers in the Information Technology world. The Center, located at the Lake Country Advanced Knowledge Center in South Hill, offers students realistic learning experiences in a simulated data center environment and prepares them to take CompTia credentials (A+, Server+, Network+, Security+).

Made possible through a grant from the Tobacco Region Revitalization Commission, the lab has been built and furnished to provide a state-of-the-art laboratory in which students will learn and hone the skills for jobs in IT. This field encompasses the application of computers to store, study, retrieve, transmit, and manipulate data or information, often in the context of a business or other enterprise.

Curriculum will be based on a proven program that targets a gap between education supply and occupational demand. The Certificate received upon successful completion is Networking and Computer Support. It is an 18-hour credit program. Classes are:

ITN 106 and ITN 107 = A+ certification. Two exams must be taken.

ITN 106 = MTA Operating Systems Fundamentals Exam 98-349

ITN 111 = Server+ and MTA Server Administration Fundamentals Exam 98-365

ITN 101 = Network+ and MTA Networking Fundamentals Exam 98-366

ITN 260 = Security+ and MTA Security Fundamentals Exam 98-367

Tommy Wright, Assistant Professor, Information Systems Technology, noted students can take the MTA exams for free.

The IT Academy will initially serve postsecondary students as well as dually enrolled students from area high schools.



By enriching the education and skill level of the regional labor pool, the IT Academy will assist in the process of attracting, retaining and providing job candidates for employers such as HP and Microsoft, increasing the ability of local citizens to participate in the global economy.

## Grants Enable Workforce Training at SVCC

Governor Terry McAuliffe announced recently that, through the New Economy Workforce Credentials Grant program, Virginia’s Community Colleges provided workforce training that enabled 2,173 Virginians to secure industry-recognized credentials, licenses, and certifications needed for high-demand careers, in the first year of the grant program.

This milestone nearly triples the number of people who were credentialed last year, bringing the total to 4,268 Virginians. More than half of the credential earners, 2,173, took advantage of the New Economy Workforce Credentials Grant program. Training for the remaining 2,095 credentials was funded by employers, federal grants, or other private sources.

Nate Humphrey of Amelia Court House enrolled in the power line worker program at Southside Virginia Community College.

The retired U.S. Army Ranger served seven combat deployments in Afghanistan and Iraq. When he came home, he was looking for that same camaraderie.

“When I retired, I missed it,” he said. “And I found it being a lineman.”

Days after completing the program, he locked down a job at Southside Electric Cooperative.

“I think the course was just at \$11,000, but with the grant, I didn’t pay anything,” he said. “The only thing I paid for was my boots and my belt.”

The Workforce Credential Grant Program is now in its second year. Right now, grants are available to support 146 training courses offered at 23 community colleges in the commonwealth.

# Nurse Aide Training

The healthcare industry is actively seeking professional Nurse Aides. This seven week course is designed for individuals desiring to work as a Certified Nurse Aide (CNA). Upon successful completion of the program students receive the certificate needed to take the Virginia NNAAP (National Nurse Aide Assessment Program) Exam to become a CNA.

## What are the job duties of a Nurse Aide?

The Nurse Aide Certificate Program is intended for the individual desiring to work as a CNA in long term or acute care. Skills obtained in the Nurse Aide Program include:

- Obtain vital signs
- Perform non-invasive monitoring as directed by the RN or LPN
- Observe for and report to the RN or LPN unexpected situations
- Express needs and changes in the resident's condition
- Monitor and document the resident's intake and output
- Document care and observations thoroughly and accurately
- Assist residents with hygiene and grooming needs
- Feed and assist residents with nutritional intake and follow dietary restrictions
- Transfer and assist residents with ambulation and mobility needs
- Assist residents with active and passive range of motion exercises
- Apply anti-embolism and pneumatic stockings
- Reapply cannula and oxygen masks for residents already receiving oxygen therapy
- Collect specimens as directed by the RN or LPN
- Utilize assistive devices, transfer aides, and other equipment safely

## Career Opportunities

Occupational objectives for this program include working as a CNA in health-related agencies including nursing homes and hospitals as well as home health positions acquired through placement agencies or private arrangements. There are many job opportunities in Southside Virginia for CNAs!

Completion of the requirements to become a Certified Nursing Assistant can be the first step on the educational ladder of the field of nursing.

According to the Department of Labor Statistics, the average wage for CNA in Virginia is \$24,110 to \$25,330 annually.

# What is the Workforce Credential Grant?

Virginia will be offsetting the tuition of select workforce training programs at community colleges by 66% with the new Workforce Credential Grant (WCG). New incentive funds to offset the cost of tuition on select high-demand credentials programs are now available and programs are open for registration. The funds are available to Virginia residents who meet Virginia domicile requirements. See list of eligible programs below.

## SVCC's WCG Eligible Programs Include:

- Certified Nursing Assistant
- Commercial Driver's License
- Medication Aide
- Power Line Worker
- Certified Massage Therapist
- Precision Machining
- Welding
- Phlebotomy
- Machining Skills Certification



Sometimes the cost of programs that prepare you for high-demand careers can create a financial barrier. The Workforce Credential Grant (WCG) underwrites the cost of select pre-approved high-demand training programs by covering two-thirds of the cost with the expectation of you obtaining the related workforce credential. You are financially responsible for the first-third. If you are financially unable to pay the first-third as determined by the predefined set of criteria, you may qualify for Workforce Financial Assistance (FANTIC). Funding for both WCG and FANTIC programs is limited.

## What is the Workforce Credential Grant (WCG)?

Workforce Credential Grant (WCG) is a program funded by the Virginia General Assembly to encourage the attainment of high-demand workforce credentials by underwriting the cost of approved credential preparation programs for Virginia residents that meet Virginia domicile requirements. You are required to pay one-third of the cost of the program with the explicit expectation you will seek and obtain the related credential identified for your program of choice. Failure to complete the class will result in your financial obligation to pay an additional one-third of the cost of the program back to the Commonwealth of Virginia. Funding for this program is limited.

Workforce Financial Assistance (FANTIC) provides funding for you if you demonstrate the required financial need in order to enroll in an approved workforce training program leading to the attainment of an industry recognized credential or licensure and are not eligible for other funding grants or financial assistance. Applicants are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis. This financial assistance will pay for 90% of your cost for the program. If you qualify, you will be re-sponsible for 10% of your portion at the time of registration. Funding for this program is limited.

## What is Expected?

Those participating in this program will be expected to regularly attend and participate in all classes (attend at least 90% of all class meetings) AND successfully attain a designated credential at the end of the program, regardless of whether that credential is embedded in the cost of the class or requires an additional fee for a credential assessment/certification exam at a third-party site.

If you qualify for the WCG Workforce Financial Assistance (FANTIC) you will pay 10% of the student obligation (one-third of the cost of the program). WCG Workforce Financial Assistance (FANTIC) will pay the remaining 90% of the student obligation. Funding for this program is limited and will be disbursed on a first come first served basis to those that meet the required qualifications. Funding for both the WCG and FANTIC programs are limited.

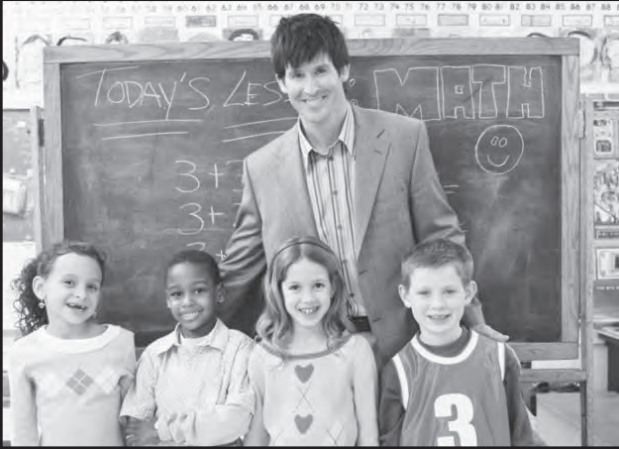

Students who register for online courses should be familiar with Blackboard, an online course management system. If you need assistance with Blackboard, email [blackboard@southside.edu](mailto:blackboard@southside.edu). After logging in to Blackboard, you will find the online faculty email directory. Please contact your instructor(s) as soon as possible via your SVCC e-mail account. Tell the instructor your name, the course for which you have registered, and your correct SVCC e-mail address. Links to the courses are made available on the first day of classes of each term. Plan to visit Blackboard as soon as classes begin to find your course web site. To be successful, remember that it is the student's responsibility to email the instructor and log in to Blackboard to find the online course.

Online students must have a computer, Internet access, word processing software (Microsoft Word is preferred) and be proficient users of both Blackboard and E-mail accounts. Other technical requirements can be found at <http://www.southside.edu>, Academics, SVCC Dis-

tance Education, Minimal Technical Requirements. Students who wish to use SVCC's facilities for these requirements can travel to any campus or center to do so. Campus computer labs have posted hours and may require prior permission for night or weekend use. Please check to determine when campus computer labs or the campus library computers are available for use.

Students are responsible for submitting assignments and taking examinations according to the instructor's directions. Students must adhere to the conditions stated in the syllabus regarding procedures for taking tests and examinations and/or performing laboratory exercises. These conditions may require students to travel to a college campus, another school, a public library, or other site to take tests and examinations under supervision and/or perform laboratory exercises or field work.

## Definitions for online courses

### ONLINE COURSE

This is a course that is 100% online. It requires as much or more work as a seated course, but you can do the work at times that are convenient to you. It will require internet access. Students should e-mail their teacher as soon as they register. See website for details. You may be required to come to campus for proctored exams or graded activities.



### HYBRID COURSE

This is a course that meets at a college location for 50 percent of the class and on Blackboard for 50 percent of the class. The seated time will be published with the course offerings. It will require internet access.

### INTERNET ASSISTED COURSE

These are seated classes but will require some internet assignments. It will require internet access.

# SVCC Admission and Registration Information for Credit Courses

Any person who has a high school diploma or the equivalent or is at least 18 years of age and is able to benefit from a program at the College may be admitted as a Curricular Student or as a Non-Curricular Student. High school students may also be enrolled in credit courses with their principal's permission.

**Curricular Students (full- or part-time) who wish to be admitted to a specific degree, diploma, or certificate program should:**

- 1. Submit a completed Application for Admission.
- 2. Submit a completed Application for Virginia In-State Tuition Rates if claiming entitlement to in-state rates.
- 3. Have high school or GED and previous college transcripts sent to SVCC.
- 4. Complete SVCC placement testing.
- 5. After items 1 through 4 are complete, have an admissions interview with a college counselor for final acceptance into a curriculum.

**Non-Curricular Students (part- or full-time)not working toward completion of a degree, diploma, or certificate need only complete items 1 and 2 above.**







Placement testing and placement recommendations—If you are enrolling in a curricular student in any program or are enrolling in a math or English class, take the SVCC placement tests and have an interview with a counselor. Your placement results may indicate that one or more Developmental courses are required. If you have taken a Developmental course and received an "R", re-enroll in it. If you received a "U", consult your advisor and your instructor before re-enrolling.

**Methods of Payment**—Tuition and fees are due upon registration, and may be paid by cash, check, money order,   or . Checks and money orders must be made out to SVCC for the exact amount only.   and  allow the college to accept the credit card only if it is in the student's name.

**Veterans**—to be eligible for full- or part-time VA educational benefits (GI Bill), a veteran must complete all steps for a Curricular Student. VA applications may be obtained from the College Veterans Affairs Office.

**Financial Aid**—Anyone who will be a Curricular Student may apply for financial aid. Applications may be obtained from the Financial Aid Office.

**Senior Citizen**—Persons 60 or over may be eligible for waiver of fees and tuition. Contact either Office of Admissions and Records for details.

**Minimum Enrollment for Classes**—Each class is offered on the condition of adequate enrollment, and the College reserves the right to cancel or discontinue any course announced herein either because of small enrollment or for other reasons deemed sufficient by the College. The College also reserves the right to close registration in a course after maximum enrollment has been reached.

**Refunds**—Students shall be eligible for a refund for those credit hours dropped during the add/drop period for the session. The refund will be at the full credit rate. After the add/drop period has passed, there will be no refunds, except for certain federal student financial aid recipients. This deadline should not be confused with the last day to withdraw without academic penalty for the standard semester, the last day to drop with refund is published in the college calendar. Refunds are issued to the registrant only, after the census date (last day to drop with a refund).

To be eligible for a refund under any of the circumstances set forth in the foregoing paragraph, a student must execute an official drop form. Full refunds will be made when a course is cancelled by the College. If you have questions about the refund policy, contact either SVCC Admissions and Records office.

**Grades**—It is the responsibility of the student to access their grades at the end of each semester through the college's website at [www.southside.edu](http://www.southside.edu). Students should report any discrepancies to the Admissions and Records Office within two weeks after the official end of the semester.
