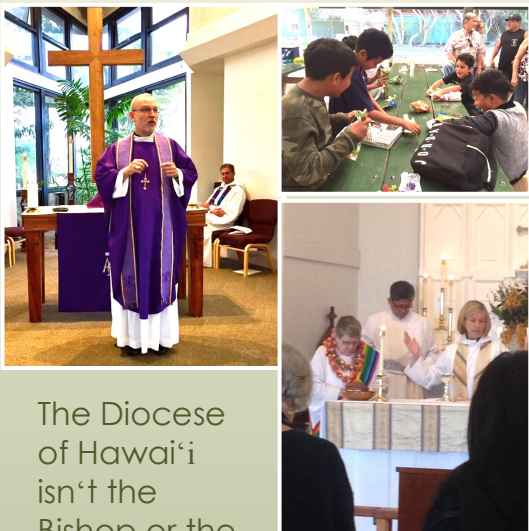


## Diocesan Mutual Ministry Review

# Strategic Initiatives.

The Diocese of Hawai'i has embarked on an exciting project collectively called the Strategic Initiatives. It includes:

- Mutual Ministry Review
- Strategic Plan
- Bishop's Personal Performance Review



## Why is this different from earlier efforts?

- Earlier Strategic Plans had lofty goals, and lists of things to do that were not enough to get us to our goals. This process, **starting with your input for the MMR**, seeks to more clearly identify our mutual goals and *how we can realistically achieve them*. This includes identifying how we and our Church must change collectively to fulfill the ministry to which we are called.
- Dr. Kim Payton, an organizational psychologist, has been engaged as an expert consultant to lead the Diocese through this process.
- There is a Strategic Initiatives Group that will develop the plan, made up of members of the Standing Committee, Diocesan Council, and others in the Diocese.

A Mutual Ministry Review (MMR) is a serious look at how we are working together to further the mission and ministry we are called to by Jesus Christ. Who are 'we'? 'We' is all of us—individuals, parishes, missions, the Office of the Bishop.

Are we together doing what we are called to do?

For that matter, what is it we are called to do?
