## Bar Mitzvah Mensch in Action!

The summer of 2017 has been a special one for the Yashar family. They were clear that they wanted to bring extra meaning to Will's September bar mitzvah. Will's mom, Lourdes knew that JFS would be a great place to help make this happen.

Lourdes tells us, "I saw the Equipped to Learn Backpack project in the Beth David newsletter and I asked Will,

'Do you want to do this?'" Will thought it was a great idea, and they met with Sheila Monheit, JFS' Volunteer Coordinator, who helped Will and Lourdes explore how they could make their participation in the project meaningful.

According to Sheila, "Will was very resourceful. He had a lot of ideas of how to implement the program in ways that were personal and far-reaching. He was extremely eager to brainstorm ideas of how he could reach as many people as pos-

sible. We talked about ideas, but he *owned it.*"

**Will then set to work.** He tells us how he did it: "I started off writing a letter to my bar mitzvah guest list. It told why we were helping, who we were helping, and my feelings on the project. I posted it on social media and told my friends from school."

The project became very important to Will. As he says, "There are other projects you can do but there are people right in this area benefit-

ting from this. Some of the people it helps are refugees. Both my parents are immigrants. Both my parents got help when they came. With all the trauma in the Middle East, we need some good stuff in our life."

Will went off to Camp Newman and Lourdes sent out Will's letter with the backpack request tags. People began

dropping off backpacks, school supplies, and cash for the program at their house and at the senior care homes Lourdes runs. Lourdes and **Bar Mitzvah Mensch** • *continued on page 4*

# From Our President

## Volunteers Are the Soul of JFS

Dear Friends,  
Where would JFS be without our volunteers? All 700 of them!

As we celebrate the 40th anniversary of JFS of Silicon Valley, we marvel at the impact in our community. We've got 17 paid employees who administer, develop, manage and monitor a big variety of programs to meet the needs of a big variety of people. And many of those 17 are only part-time!

**Volunteers are heroes.** Who helps gather, package and deliver all sorts of items for the JFS food program, which assisted almost 1,100 people this past year? Volunteers. Throughout the year, and especially during holidays, they make a difference for single parent families, frail seniors, disabled or unemployed adults, and refugees.

**Volunteers are valuable.** Consider the 128 Knitzvah members who create thousands of beautiful clothing articles every year for babies, cancer patients, isolated seniors, foster youth, recently-arrived immigrants and other people in need for nearly 20 community based organizations. Did you know Knitzvah created over 24,000 items in its first 12 years?

**Volunteers are essential.** 22 attorneys in Silicon Valley donate their expertise, experience and time through our Pro Bono Legal Immigration Clinic to help a multitude of refugees apply

for permanent legal status and American citizenship after they've run the multi-year gauntlet of extreme vetting just to be accepted into the US. In 2016-17 they helped 143 people at JFS.

**Volunteers are a life line.** During the last year, JFS volunteers brought a smile, a willing ear and a soft shoulder, as well as food and other necessities, to more than 100 Holocaust survivors living in our immediate area. Some of these volunteers are part of the Friendly Visitor program which makes a difference for everyone involved. My wife and I can attest to that.

**Volunteers care.** Volunteers are people just like you and me, who want to make the world a better place one person at a time. Whether through the popular Embrace-A-Family program every November and December, the Backpack Drive in the summer, or other year-round safety net services, volunteers say the word "WE" in a world of "ME."

As we contemplate our life and family during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, I'm confident you'll realize there are few more worthy endeavors than that of being a volunteer. Is there a better way to begin 5778 than by applying Jewish values to the needs of our community?

**We at JFS are proud of how we strive for excellence in the many ways we help people have better lives.** This fall marks 10 years of Embrace-A-Family, which gives low income seniors and families happy holidays – and generous donors meaningful ways to make a difference. Our 3rd Equipped to Learn Backpack Drive brought in backpacks, school supplies – and big smiles - for nearly 200 preschool through adult learners. Our Shabbat Meals Program, begun in 2009, keeps evolving. We're proud to announce that Pars Kosher Market is our new partner to bring delicious, kosher meals to isolated seniors, adults and families. The new Jewish Family Services branch office at Chai House is beautiful! Our staff has wasted no time immersing themselves in the Chai House community, and we've loved the warm welcome we receive from the residents, Chai House Board, and management staff. We've stepped up our counseling and social services to the residents. This fall we're adding an MSW intern to Chai House who speaks Chinese languages to help the many Chinese Chai House residents.

Over the past year, we developed a Mental Illness Support Group with Congregation Sinai. It's co-facili-

tated by Rabbi Josh Berkenwald and Lisa Warner, LCSW and has been a godsend for those members of our Jewish community whose lives have been impacted by mental illness. Learn more about it on page 4.

As you know, JFS' focus on resettling and protecting refugees is of paramount importance. It continues to be a troubling environment for our very vulnerable clients, and we greatly appreciate your support.

**None of this good work could happen without our community partners.** We are so blessed to have the support of the Jewish Federation, JCC, Yavneh, our local synagogues (stretching from Morgan Hill to Fremont to Los Altos Hills) and schools, the high tech community, our donors, and our partners in refugee resettlement. Will started tallying everything up. By mid-August the tally was nearly \$1,500 in cash for the program, about 20 backpacks and lots of school supplies. Will, his sister Kimi, his friend JJ, and JJ's sister Chloe assembled backpacks and supplies at JFS. They had a great time. "It was really fun!" Will declared.

Will learned some important lessons from his bar mitzvah that he was happy to share with us: "In my Torah portion Ki Tavo, I learned about preparation to enter the land of Israel. You need to be ready. Boy Scouts are always prepared. In order to go to school you need the right equipment and the right stuff to learn. I'm always happy when I have two pencils by my side."

Lourdes also wanted Will and Kimi to get meaning out of this experience. "I wanted the kids to

be involved and volunteer," she says. "We're very lucky to live in Silicon Valley. We're doing fine, but I wanted Will to understand that there are kids who go to school without supplies – and to be able to help those kids. It's rewarding. It's nice to share."

Lourdes and Will have messages for all of us about getting involved. Says Will, "We live in one of the nicest places in the world and need to give back." Lourdes adds, "If everyone helps each other, it's not really hard. Many of our guests and family contributed to the project and it makes it easy. Will has learned to be grateful and give back. We can all be thankful – and help."

**JFS SV urgently needs your help!** We protect refugees who have experienced persecution due to their religion, ethnicity, political expression or sexual orientation. They come from Iran, Iraq, Afghanistan, the Former Soviet Union and various countries throughout Africa. The people we help are fleeing dire and often violent circumstances.

As the second largest refugee resettlement agency in Santa Clara County, JFS SV serves **200+** refugees annually with resettlement, pro-bono legal immigration clinic, vocational English training, job search assistance, case management, and emergency food assistance. Our services to refugees have been funded through HIAS, County of Santa Clara, United Way Silicon Valley, Silicon Valley Community Foundation, foundations, and generous individuals.

**Due to our current government's administration, funding for refugee resettlement is uncertain.** Our refugee resettlement and Connections to Work for Refugees Programs have depended on annual awards of over \$300,000 from HIAS and United Way for the past decade—and these are no longer certain. **Refugees in our care need the crucial services that JFS SV provides.
