Dear Friends,

After church last week, after sharing my sermon on Sanctuary and Solidarity, I was talking with a couple of people about the next week being the next Continuing the Conversation Sunday (still a

special thing as we don't do it every week). Mary Burks mentioned that she thought we could use one right then to discuss what the church can do to help immigrants and others being targeted in our country.

So we started talking about the world we'd like to see and how we can do our little part.

We have the ability to do that every week, to go deeper – to ask the next, more genuine question. In fact, that's when we are talking about things that really matter. It's kind of like that Sunday when Michael invited us to take more time with our passing of the peace, and asking, "How are you – really?"

Now, let me ask you to take it one step further. What if you asked that question of at least one person you didn't know, each week? What if, after every Sunday service, you prepared yourself mentally and emotionally for whenever or wherever that moment will arrive?

Who would you choose? Would you look to have the conversation as soon as you could, perhaps even Sunday afternoon or Monday? Would you wait, to ask just the right person? How would you create enough time in your schedule to make sure you had enough time to really hear them out?

There is a song that begins with the words... "I arise today." It reminds us that as Christ arose to new life, so we arise to new life.



This song, *The Deer's Cry* is attributed to St. Patrick. During my sabbatical while I lived on the island of Iona, I stayed for a time at the Catholic House of Prayer. Those of us who stayed there, gathered each morning in the chapel. The Catholic sister who ran the house led a service and each morning the service ended with a recording of this Irish song. Each morning we were invited to arise with Christ. It seemed to me to be the perfect song for an Easter people.

There's no telling who you will meet or what stories you will hear. There may be a few rejections. That's ok. How will the stories change them? Being able to share who they are and feel more connected? How will your listening to such stories change you? How will it change our neighborhoods?

With a quorum present, the meeting was opened with an opening prayer and check-ins.

Minutes of the January Cabinet, Annual and Special Cabinet Meetings were all approved.

Days Grow Shorter

A few months ago, my landlady decided she was going to put the house in which I live up for sale on May 1st. Kendall and I realized it was time to move closer to Beth, my daughter and Kendall's sister, who lives in Elgin, Oklahoma. When we made that decision, the move seemed a long time away. Now I am acutely aware of the moving date (April 21). As Kendall and I prepare to make this transition, memories of the sustaining support of the people in this church tumble through my mind making me wonder how I will survive in Oklahoma without them.

Five years ago when my husband Sig was dying, Sandy Henry sat with me by Sig's hospital bed and walked the hospital hall with me. During my Sig's 35-day hospital stay, I never felt alone as people from the church and other friends upheld me when I found it hard to function. Ladies of the church arranged a bountiful luncheon. I continue to feel grateful for ministering of Christian friends as I moved through this nightmarish time.

When I decided to sell my Antioch home, Chris Persing updated my 44-year-old house so it would be more attractive to a buyer. On Saturday when the upgrade was over, Chris stood on a ladder in my garage and threw objects I did not know how to get rid of to his workmen who gladly caught them. Chris' actions took away some of the sadness of the day.

Every Christmas since Sig died Kendall and I have spent Christmas and most Thanksgivings with Beverly Peterson and her family. Beverly's actions eased our loneliness during the holiday season. (Beverly, don't be surprised if you get phone call from me at Christmas and Thanksgiving.) When my old car "died," Beverly took me to get a new car and advised me on the pros and cons of buying cars.

Since Sig's death, Pastor Christy's never failing support has helped me better handle difficult situations. If Kendall was in a hospital emergency room or in the Kaiser hospital in Redwood City, Christy was there. If I needed Christy, I knew I could call her at any time. That knowledge made it easier to handle difficult situations.

Although I will be living in Oklahoma, every Sunday morning my thoughts will be with the congregation in a small white church in Pittsburg, California. A church that really taught to love with differences, and I grateful. May God bless you all.

Minutes for Regular Stated Meeting of Session

March 21, 2017

Called to order at 6:33 p.m. in the Camp Stoneman Room at CPC by checking in. Opening prayer was offered by moderator Rev. NEW BUSINESS:

- Deacon and Care Team. – Per the request to formally disband the Board of Deacons, CPC Deacons are now understood to be a part of the ECSM Care Team. To be able to continue to share the ministry of home communion, Presbyterian members of the ECSM Care Team need to be ordained as Deacons or Elders. Session discerned that at our next called congregational meeting, there will be a motion to **formally merge the Board of Deacons into the ECSM Care Team.** Our ordained Deacons are approved to do their function within the joint ECSM Care Team. As the Jan. 17th minutes of Session state, session "Approve authorizing deacons to serve home communion in 2017." Session will receive regular reports from the ECSM Care Team. MSC.
- Westgate Park Board Incident: *Loss of tenant, status of street light on West side of church, additional security cameras needed? The only camera is by the porch and it doesn't reach that portion of the parking lot. We didn't find any film of destruction in the act.*
- Deacon and Elder Installation Certificates. Jim has requested Jessica to order a few forms.

CONTINUING BUSINESS:

- Progress of FCCA request to move their three crosses and bell to CPC:
From Chris Persing emails dated 02-28-17 and 03-07-17 (condensed). "I gave a Pittsburg planning technician a scaled drawing of the three crosses. The crosses are 19' x 8'-6", 14'-6" x 6'-6" and 12' x 5'-6". The committee met and determined the crosses will be classified as ancillary structures, and will require a \$425 administrative design review fee, plus other fees not yet determined. We need to determine location on our site a minimum of 20' setback from the inside edge of the sidewalk on Leland. The configuration of the crosses must be determined and scaled drawings submitted to the City for administrative design review, which will take about a month."
The bell and location was not included in this discussion, as Session had previously thought the bell would be located in the courtyard of the church, in a location less susceptible to vandalism and theft. Let's also consider to the left of the front (west) steps where the liquid amber tree is, leading up into the chapel (where the Zollars Memorial Garden will be placed).
- The Chapel Improvement Fund received half of the special offering from the February 19 Clay Foor concert. The total offering was \$271.00, so CPC's half is \$135.50. This will be used to fund improvements such as new carpet, painting the inside, a "hearing loop" and other projects as funds are available.
According to George Stevens' 03/13/17 email his range of estimates for replacing sanctuary carpeting is \$4700-\$5400. He believes the \$4700 would work. Job done, clean up and gone is bid.
- Lamp for the piano. Elaine is looking for a lamp to put on the piano.
- Music Library Filing. To start the filing of music and having it in a directory to more easily find it, Will will give his New Way music folder to Jessica to scan and put on-line in a 'cloud' type file. Then it could all be in one place and accessed by anyone anytime. This will be the start of building this very large library of music.
- Appoint 2017 session representative to the Personnel Committee (who will serve as chair) Mary Burks will continue as Chair. MSC.
- David & Lois Zollars Memorial Butterfly Garden. David Arms, Alison Lemons (daughter) Myrdell Dybdal and Mary Burks met on February 12. At that time they chose the best location to be to the left of the front steps into the sanctuary. The Zollars family will take it from here and do all the installation, work, etc. They are working with a landscape architect to know what kinds of plants, etc. to use. Lucas, Myrdell and Mary have agreed to keep an eye on it and maintain that space as needed that the gardener does not do.
03-07-17 Email from Alison Lemons: "I actually have 3 Heuchera (big leafy border plant) and 6 pink Astilbe (flowering butterfly plants) started in transfer pots and planted some Milkweed seeds to get a few things going. I will keep checking to see when the rest of the colorful plants are available in nurseries. I am trying to get my family to commit to a date, hopefully soon now that we are in March, to come up and get dirt turned and plants in. I am happy that we are finally getting things going and have the spot where it will be located worked out. I thank you again for your support and the commitment to support this Memorial garden." The family will choose a date and let us know. Dave will oversee the installation of a sprinkler head on an existing outlet.
- Joint work party with Ministerios: *scheduled for April 8th. Meet on Saturday at 9:00 am.* Our priorities are: Clean out the (1) Children's Sunday School Room, (2) Mailroom, (Gail) Christian Ed Closet, and the (3) Stairwell to upstairs. Painting priorities are (1) CE Hallway (take down all the posters gently), (2) Children's Sunday School Room, (3) Stoneman Room.
- SH Sound system: *Both CPC and FCCA have approved funds for upgrading SH Speakers and wiring.* MSC.
- Ethan Sullivan's Eagle Scout project: *Ethan was invited to this meeting, he gave a history of the project and the vandalism of the pipes. He has all the components to do so except the right PVC pipes. Given the potential vandalism inside the play area, we asked Ethan to saw off the posts at the ground level. We asked Ethan to research creating a stationary bell support system to install the bell. Report back on that with a quote to remove the liquid amber trees. Then create a plan for the installation, that he can lead when we are ready to move forward.* MSC.


