



Before that I worked with homeless families in Orange County, California with an organization called the Illumination Foundation. There, the Lord blessed me with the opportunity to build a Children's Resource Center in a very depressed city. That experience continues to be one of the most transformative times in my life. I was tested at every turn, but watching those children walk into the Center for the first time was the fiercest reminder of God's love that I had ever seen.

I am blessed to have a wonderfully supportive husband, Brent, and two precocious cats Rita and Hendrick. During home football games, you will find us at Spartan Stadium cheering on MSU. (Stop by our tailgate! Brent's a great cook!) When I'm not supporting the Spartans or at church, you'll find me working on a craft or with my nose in a book.

I am looking forward to meeting everyone in the coming months. Don't be afraid to stop by!

STEWARSHIP THOUGHT: In today's second reading, we hear the author of the letter to the Hebrews liken the daily life of the Christian steward to a race, a long-distance race perhaps, certainly not a spring; requiring endurance and a single-minded focus on Jesus at the finish line. Good stewards are firmly committed to running the race, to live the Christian life to the fullest, to keep their eyes focused on Jesus. They don't grow weary. They don't lose heart. They know there is immense joy waiting for them at the finish line. Are you fully committed to living each day for Christ? Are you running the race, or are you simply jogging? Just walking? Sitting? Going backwards? Going nowhere? Some of us may want to reflect on what we can do to run the race with even more conviction.
