

Transfigured by / & into humbleness

As our annual "campaign of Christian service"** continues, I'm struck by the contrast between a dictionary definition, and what I'm experiencing.

Last week I shared how Dictionary.com defines campaign as "a systematic course of **aggressive** activities for some specific purpose." At the time, the Ash Wednesday fasting and the other disciplines of Lent felt aggressive to me.

But over the past week, a few gifts to our upcoming Capital Campaign trickled in. Or, I should say, they *lumped* in. One family in particular has left me a bit stunned by their generosity. This is because I know their lifestyle. There are so many other things they could have spent that money on: A new large home in a tony neighborhood, perhaps. More luxurious vacations (lots of them).

Instead, they chose to make a generous sacrifice because they share the dream of our church lifestyle being enhanced by a new youth/multipurpose room and expanded gathering area. And here's what's even more meaningful about their donation and the others: **no one asked for them!**

You will probably never know who these families are. They are not aggressive, "look at me" people.

And yes, it might require some rather "aggressive action" for us to gather up \$2.5 million from one another for this project. (Even with the sizeable gifts thus far we have a very long way to go.)

But this is what Lent and these families have taught me thus far: What will really ensure the success of our Capital Campaign — and the Season of Lent — is the same attribute that Jesus taught us through his life and death: **humility.**

*From the opening Collect prayer for Ash Wednesday: *Grant O Lord, that we may begin with holy fasting this campaign of Christian service, so that, as we take up battle against spiritual evils, we may be armed with weapons of self restraint.*"

Yet another campaign: The annual Catholic Services Appeal is underway to support the works of the Diocese of Grand Rapids. Please watch your mailboxes for a packet from Bishop

David Walkowiak. Our parish share of this \$5.73 million appeal is \$126,517. Would you please make a pledge to CSA soon?

I hope you know that I do not like asking people for money. It literally makes me sick to the stomach. But when I think of all the people whose lives are enriched by our mission of worship, education, charity and service — and a bit of indigestion is worth it.

OTHER LENTEN NEWS

Nearly every Catholic church in the Diocese of Grand Rapids will have a priest to celebrate reconciliation with you from 5-8pm Thursday, March 16. For an examination of conscience and list of parishes go to dioceseofgrandrapids.org.

Do you have your heart set on feasting on Corned Beef on St. Patrick's Day? March 17 falls on a Friday this year. Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat for Latin rite Catholics 14 years of age and older.

You'll be pleased to know that per canon law, the bishop has told the priests of our diocese to be "generous" in granting permission to "dispense, commute, or transfer the obligation of abstinence" to those who ask for it next Friday. So, please see me if you want to eat meat on St. Patrick's Day with a clear conscience.

These are the sorts of things that non-Catholics roll their eyes about! But they are also lessons for us in humility.

Here's another Lenten prayer that illustrates our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It's a preface to the Eucharistic prayer:

"It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father...

For you will that our self-denial should give you thanks, humble our sinful pride, contribute to the feeding of the poor, and so help us imitate you in your kindness..."






