




Living in Mercy

CREATING A WHOLESOME PLACE
 FOR ALL GOD'S CHILDREN

Imagine being followed around by someone who repeated the last few words of everything you said.

You'd be more careful about what you say, right?

Fortunately, the words being repeated last Tuesday morning were those such as "our Lord, amen," and "thanks be to God."

As he often does, two-year-old Matthew Lawrence had come to daily Mass with his mother, Jennifer. It has been a gift to watch this little one, who once slept on mom's shoulder, now stands beside her and practice his growing vocabulary.

I couldn't help but marvel on how nurturing it is for children to experience worship.

Sadly, our culture in the United States has lost all its language filters. A priest friend who reads the New York Times told me he was appalled last Sunday to see the once-forbidden four-letter word that begins with the sixth letter of the alphabet spelled out on the front page.

Which makes me all the more grateful for parents like Chris and Jennifer Lawrence who bring their children to Mass.

The words, music and gestures of liturgy marinate us in a pool of holiness. Even if a person cannot comprehend what is happening, grace seeps into the soul through osmosis. I still have memories of playing on the padded kneeler during Mass as a toddler. The practice of Sunday Mass is part of my DNA.

As our society grows more vulgar, I so appreciate all you parents who counter that by bringing your children to Mass and helping them memorize the prayers of our Catholic faith.


Close friends know that I can be quite shocking with my own language.

A boy named Matthew and a man named Donald have reminded me to watch what I say. Words do matter.

"Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life," announces the dismissal at Mass. Life includes our vocabulary.


All catechists and volunteers who work with children are required to attend Virtus Training. We encourage other adults to be trained as well.



I commonly ask my couples during their marriage prep this question, and inevitably the answer is that they could grow more. They're not alone, we can all grow in our prayer lives, even the Pope. Prayer offers people an opportunity to open their hearts to share intentions, fears, hopes, gratitude and so much more with God and in some cases hear God's words for them. It is essential to grow closer to God and grow as an everyday steward. So, how can we grow? For some it's to begin setting aside time (weekly or daily), for others it may be adding to the current time they spend in prayer, while others may seek a spiritual director. The key is taking stock of where you are and trusting that God meets you there and journeys with you as you seek to grow. 
