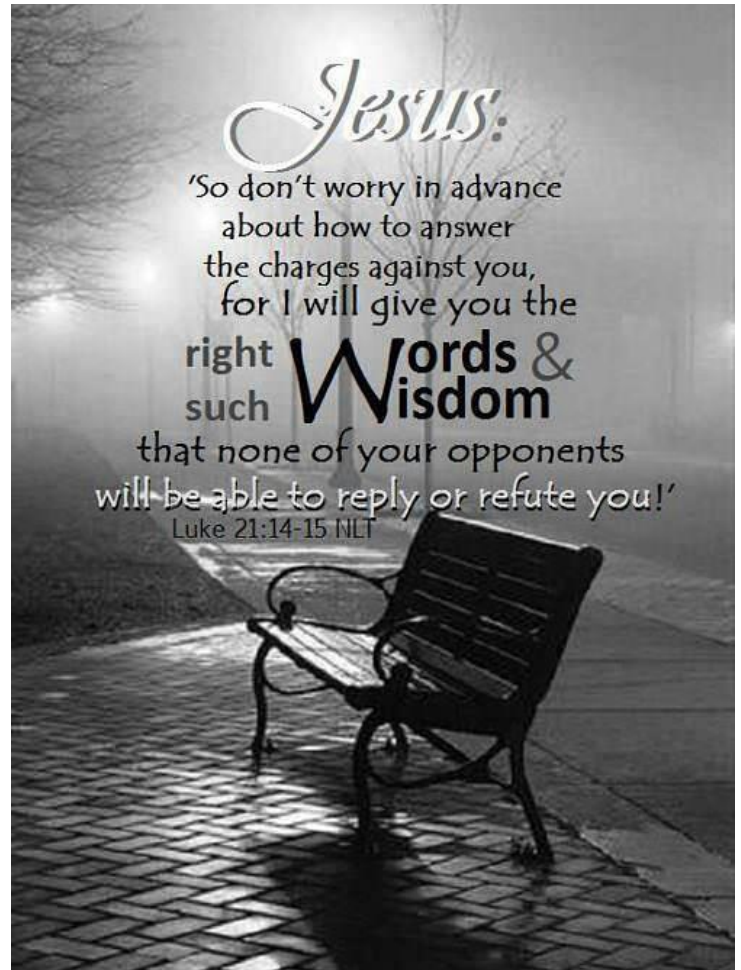

**POST-ELECTION THOUGHTS and PRAYERS**

This was the opening prayer we used at Mass on Election Day:

O God, who arranges all things according to a wonderful design, graciously receive the prayers we pour out to you for our country, that, through the wisdom of its leaders and the integrity of its citizens, harmony and justice may be assured and lasting prosperity come with peace. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

With the election results in, many people might question the prayer's sentiment about God arranging "all things according to a wonderful design."

Another group of people is whooping it up, certain that President Donald Trump will "make America great again."

It's just like eight years ago, when people cheered the election of President Barack Obama and his promises of "hope," and "change we can believe in."

Will humanity ever mature beyond the idea that one leader can solve all our problems (or that one person is responsible for them all)?

It would seem that more than any other group of people, Catholic-Christians should know that real change only comes through shared sacrifice. The leadership of Jesus Christ and the first disciples is our eternal example. We participate in this sacrifice every time we celebrate Mass.

In his campaign, President-elect Trump frequently promised that he would "drain the swamp in Washington" Actually, each one of us is a tiny organism in the enormous swamp of God's beautiful creation. What nourishment and clarity do you bring to your neck of the swamp? Are there toxins you spew? These are the sorts of question we each need to ask, rather than depending on someone else to make America great again.

ELECTION TALLY: Last Tuesday, 1,181 residents in Grandville Precinct 3 voted at St. Pius X. That's 29 more than the number of people who came to our Lord's Day liturgies last weekend. Because the Eucharist is the heart of our parish, I had hoped our Mass attendance would exceed voter turnout. But I'm just glad people voted and we could share Danner Hall with the community.

LOOKING AHEAD

► **Next Sunday we conclude the 2016 Liturgical Year.** We will celebrate the SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE. At the 10:30am Mass, we will welcome 15 individuals who have begun the journey of full membership in the Roman Catholic Church.

► **More invitations for generosity:** Many organizations have begun making their year-end appeals. The Church is no different. We have two more special collections before the end of 2016. Next week is the **Catholic Campaign for Human Development.** These revenues remain in the United States for projects that target the causes of poverty. (See Bishop Walkowiak's letter on page 5.) On Dec. 11, is the annual appeal for the **Retirement Fund for Religious.** Meanwhile, please consider our parish and its upcoming Capital Campaign in your year-end giving. A \$3 million project envisions replacement of our parking lots and boilers, plus an expanded Gathering Area and new Youth/Multi-purpose room.

Think of this: all our ministries here happen because of the generous gifts of our members. When we provide ministries or services to people, there's no invoice. Thank you for any part you play in helping to make this possible.

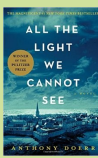

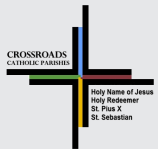

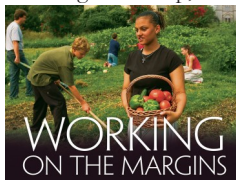

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Next weekend, November 19-20, you will have the ability to help our brothers and sisters in need when the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) collection takes place in our parishes.

The CCHD is the U.S. Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) domestic anti-poverty program providing hope for those on the margins of society who experience the realities of living in poverty. The CCHD supports programs to fight the root causes of poverty and social injustice in America offering a hand-up, not a hand out. Funding from the collection sustains programs which heal the wounds of crime and violence, advocate for more just policies, protect God's creation, and develop stronger communities.
