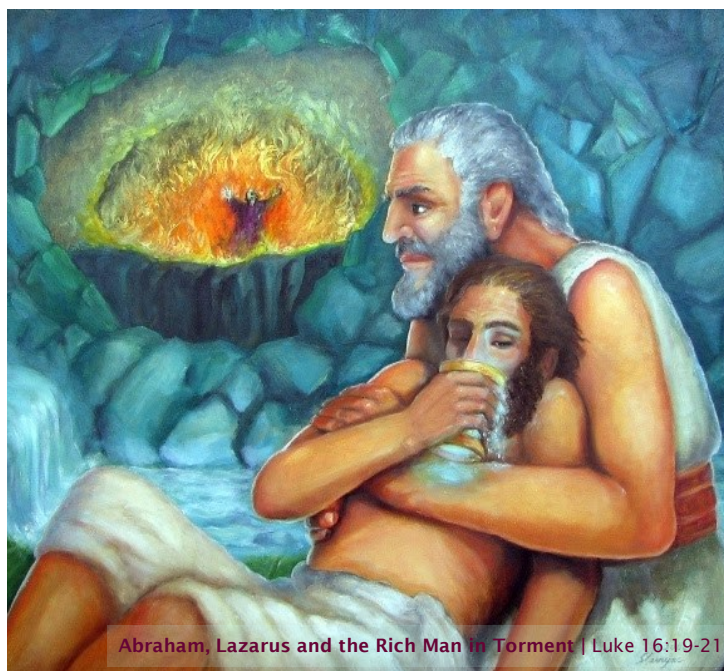

CHOSEN BY CHRIST & choosing to: *take risks.*

Amazing Grace — Imagine being dropped off at Danner Hall some Sunday evening. When you step into the building, you are ordered to remove your shoes and drop them in a large garbage bag with the shoes of all the people who arrived before you.

Next, you must blow up a balloon, and then go to a table where you are assigned a leader; whom you may or may not know. In your stocking feet, you manage to find this person in the crowd and discover you are now part of a team that includes people you'd never choose to associate yourself with because in your experience they are more popular, nerdy, talented or weird than you are.

For the next hour and a half, you compete with the other teams in a variety of contests, including Slip 'n Slide Kickball and Find Your Shoes.

I've just described what you would have experienced two weeks ago if you were a seventh or eighth grader at St. Pius X Parish. It was the launch of another year of "Middle School Edge," our religious education and Confirmation preparation program.

The night was modeled after the reality television show, "The Amazing Race." For this event, it was called "The Amazing Grace."

As I watched these adolescents enter into this experience, I couldn't help but marvel at their courage. They risked humiliation, soaked clothes and contaminated sneakers simply because they were told to.

I marveled even more at the courage of the adult leaders; the catechists who risk being a little crazy to help our youth grow. More importantly, I admire their commitment. These very

busy parents offer Sunday after Sunday for the good of our parish youth.

Sadly, few parents in our parish are willing to be so engaged in our parish formation programs.

What happens to us adults that keeps us from taking risk; from going beyond our comfort zone? (Do you know how difficult it is for our ushers to find people brave enough to bring up the gifts at Mass? I agreed to lead one of the teams only because they were short an adult.).

"It was not you who chose Christ, but Christ who chose you, and appointed you to go and bear fruit...."

Today we celebrate Catechetical Sunday. This is when we honor the people in our parish who take risks; they step beyond what might be safe and familiar to "echo" our faith in our formal religious education programs. It's not always easy teaching a group of people of any age — be it 1st graders, 7th graders or adults. But as Christians, we follow a long line of holy people who knew they were chosen by Christ, and choose to risk themselves to show others his Amazing Grace.

I hope to see you at today's parish picnic! Sorry I will need to excuse myself a bit early to head up north for the Fall Convocation of Priests. Because I'm on the planning committee, there's lots of work Sunday night and Monday.

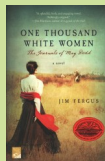
