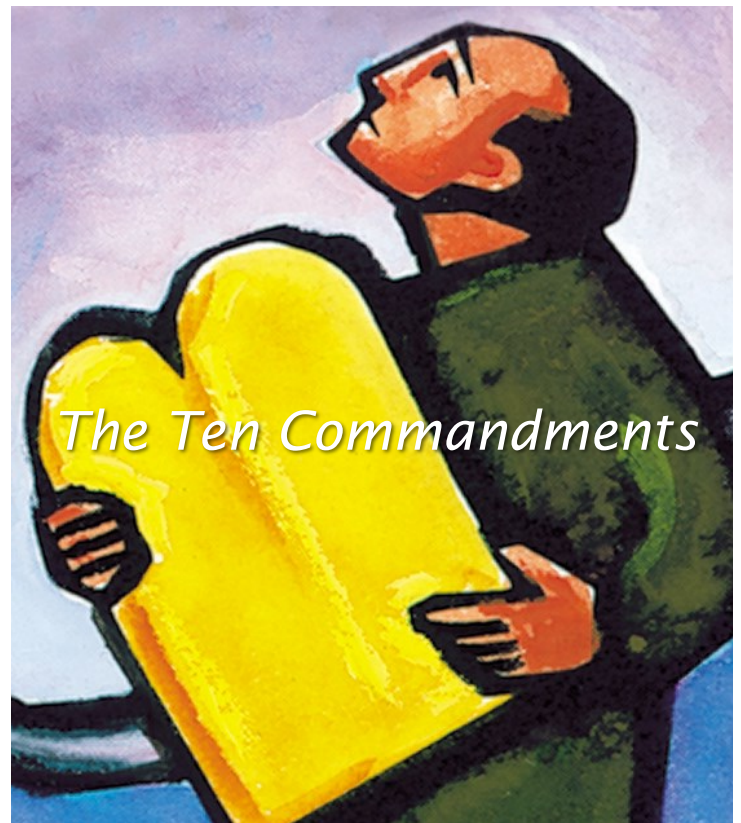

LOOKING BACK: Last week was quite hectic with parish events on Thursday and Friday evenings, plus funerals on Friday and Saturday mornings:

■ Friday's Funeral Mass was for our second-eldest parishioner: Everett "Greg" Gregersen. Greg served in World War II as a mechanic on the USS Enterprise, the world's first nuclear-powered aircraft carrier. For many more years, he served at St. Pius X as usher with team "C." Even after retiring from ministry, Greg would step from his pew on the chapel side to help when needed on Saturday nights.

If you're wondering who our eldest parishioner is, that's Ruth Matthews who resides at Brookcrest. She is 98.

■ The big events last week included our tri-annual **Leadership Night** on Thursday. These leadership nights provide professional development opportunities for the members of key parish committees, as called for in the pastoral plan. For instance, Thursday's evening included a presentation by Tiffany Page of Catholic Charities on the art of recruiting and keeping volunteers.

Friday night was **Between Heaven and Mirth**, a "thank you" to all who serve in parish ministry.

■ The 8:30am Mass will include anointing parishioner Linda Harnish in the Sacrament of the Sick. While we don't typically single-out one person at

Mass for this sacrament, this situation is unique: On Valentine's day, Linda will donate a kidney to her cousin Joe. The details of how Linda came into contact with Joe after being out of touch with him for 45 years is one of those "God stories" of providence.

"If the parish family would pray for God's blessing on this transplant, that it is successful and healing goes well I would be most grateful," Linda said. "I want this to be a testament to following God's leading and 'doing what you can,

where you are, with what you have to be Christ's hands and feet on this earth"

Linda is the wife of the late Dave Harnish, who led the St. Pius X Stewardship Committee for nearly 20 years.

■ At the 10:30 am Mass we welcome Fr. Andrew Kolenda, LC, as main celebrant.

Father Andrew's parents, Donald and Julie, are parishioners here along with a brother, three sisters and a niece. He was ordained to the priesthood in Rome last December for the Legionnaires of Christ, an international congregation of priests and seminarians. Although Father Kolenda has not lived in Michigan for nearly two decades, let us all say: **Welcome Home!**

■ A special welcome at the 10:30am Mass is also extended to nearly 40 families with children preparing for First Reconciliation in March and First Holy Communion during the Easter season. Following Mass, these families will take part in an afternoon retreat to help them get a better understanding of how sin hurts everyone, but God forgives and heals his people when they participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

I'm finding it important to invest more time and space in the bulletin writing about parish news. That's because there's a real need to highlight all the good things being accomplished by ordinary people to counteract the negativity flowing from the White House and the Halls of Congress.

I feel my heart is being torn in multiple directions. Part of the tearing comes from stances that blatantly reject everything Jesus teaches in the gospel about love of God, self and neighbor. Another force of the tearing comes from being aware of people whom I love and respect—many who do wonderful acts of mercy—whose stance seems at odds with Catholic-Christian teaching insisting we must welcome the stranger.

I guess our first task these days is to keep praying that essential verse in the Prayer of St. Francis: "O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek...to be understood as to understand."
