Judy Meikle: Solitary Confinement – The Torture of Prolonged Isolation in our Prisons



On any given day, more than 80,000 people in the United States are held in solitary confinement. In this interesting presentation, Judy Meikle will take us inside a correctional facility to focus on the effect of solitary confinement on people who are isolated in small cells for

23 hours a day, seven days a week.

An educator and long-time advocate for racial justice and prison abolition, Judy is active in the prison ministry of her Quaker faith community, traveling throughout New York State, Connecticut, and New Jersey on her mission. A founding member of the Solitary Confinement Project at Wilton Quaker Meeting, she works as a project manager at Co-Creating Effective and Inclusive Organizations in New Haven.

Join us to learn about this way of life and to understand how solitary confinement can affect prisoners. We are grateful to have Judy Meikle as our speaker and thank our member, Virginia Auster, for bringing her to us.

Bob Fatherley: The Life of World-Famous Cellist, Jacqueline du Pré

Historian Bob Fatherley's presentation will consist of a film and a talk about one of the world's leading cellists, Jacqueline du Pré, who served as a role model for many young musicians.

During the late 1960s and early 1970s, Miss du Pré and her husband, conductor and pianist Daniel Barenboim, were admired for their energy, musicality, and youthful glamor. Together, they helped create the South Bank Summer Musical Festival in London.



Miss du Pré's playing was characterized by an unusual mixture of elegance and ferocity and was known to produce a mellow sound of unusual size. However, by the mid 1970s, her career was cut short by multiple sclerosis, which rendered her virtually paralyzed. She put all of her energies into two major activities – teaching and working for MS research. In 1981, Miss du Pré's story became the subject of a Broadway play, *Duet for One*, by Tom Kempinski, which starred Anne Bancroft. Miss de Pre died in 1987 at 42 years of age.

On Wednesday, November 15, we will visit two destinations in Waterbury, CT. The first is the **Mattatuck Museum**, an art and regional history museum founded in 1912. Our guided tour will showcase the works of Winslow Homer including prints, engravings, and paintings, with special reference to domestic and daily life in the 19th century and the changing role of women. Of interest also are textile works of an internationally celebrated contemporary sculptor, Nnenna Okore, who created an installation commemorating the colors and landscapes of her childhood home in Nigeria. The Waterbury Button Gallery, a collection of more than 3,000 buttons, will also be available for viewing after the tour.



Following lunch at **Signatures**, which specializes in American and European cuisine, we will proceed to **Fascia's Chocolates**, a family company that has been handcrafting chocolates since 1964. A behind-the-scenes look into the factory itself via remote-controlled camera will be coupled with a tasting and demonstrations. The total cost of the trip, excluding lunch and driver's gas reimbursement of \$6 in cash, will be \$19.
