Carpool & Go!

On Tuesday, June 12, we will visit Wethersfield, CT, a town which is a living museum. There we'll have an 11:00 guided tour of three colonial buildings – the Webb-Deane-Stevens homes - some of which contain original furnishings and all of which have interesting histories. The Webb home served as George Washington's headquarters in May 1781 when he met the French Admiral Comte de Rochambeau to plan the joint French/American campaign in Yorktown – in what became the winning battle of the American Revolution. The Silas Deane house, built in 1770, was home to a colonial diplomat who served with Benjamin Franklin at the French court during the American Revolution. After lunch at Lucky Lou's, we'll visit the beautiful sanctuary at First Church and tour its ancient burying grounds filled with gravestones decorated with designs popular in past eras.
