

NEW MEMBER EDUCATION SPECIALIST EXPECTATIONS

Successful applicants for this role will have experience as a facilitator and/or educator and have a deep understanding of facilitating to different learning styles. Volunteers will assist chapter leaders in navigating and finding a deeper connection to the Fraternity's new member program. A volunteer in this role will motivate and encourage incremental changes for the future and identify any challenges that need further assistance from Fraternity professional staff. Applicants must be available to attend the summer training and, if directed by the Fraternity, travel to collegiate chapters in the specialist role.

Mentor leaders in collegiate chapters who are responsible for new member education
Partner with the Fraternity
Participate in Fraternity trainings
Support the Fraternity's relationship with host institutions
Open and prompt communication with Fraternity professional staff and volunteers
Be a connection to campus resources such as social, mental health, safety, etc.
Encourage compliance with provided education curriculum and best practices
Coach sister development chairmen in responsible planning and facilitation techniques and executing new member ceremonies and rituals
Create and promote topical training materials for chapters and advisors





Promote awareness and understanding of all Phi Sigma Sigma policies as they relate to new member education
Work with program and services staff to ensure any Incident/Behavior Notices are submitted and supported with documentation
Commit to one year of volunteer service in the specialist role (May 2018 through May 2019)
