Who is eligible to participate in the PBA Membership Challenge?

All PBA members and local executive officers are eligible to participate in the Challenge. PBA employees are not eligible nor are any consultants for or vendors to PBA.

What happens if PBA does not reach its goal of at least 4,760 builder and associate members?

There will be no drawing. Contributed monies will be returned to the donors or redirected to PaCAH or the PA Foundation for Housing as the individual donors prefer.

Can I get credit for members I recruited during the first half of 2017?

No. We are sorry; but for purposes of the Challenge, we can only give credit for members recruited and reported between August 1st and December 31st, 2017.

Can I get credit for new Affiliate members recruited?

No. You only get an entry in the drawing for new builder or associate members recruited. New Affiliate, Student and NAHB Student Chapter Alumni members are greatly appreciated, but will not merit an entry in the drawing.

What happens if I recruit five members during the Challenge period?

You receive five entries into the drawing. You receive another entry for every new member you recruit. There is no limit to the number of entries you can obtain. Each entry increases your odds of winning.

What happens if I recruit a new member during the Challenge period but my local membership total declines?

As long as PBA meets its overall goal, you still receive an entry in the drawing.

What happens if I recruit a new member during the Challenge period but PBA fails to reach the 4,760 member threshold?

If PBA fails to reach the 4,700 member threshold there will be no drawing and no prize will be awarded.

What are the thresholds for the prize money?

PBA Ultimate Goal: 4,850 builder and associate members 100% of total prize money

PBA Intermediate Goal: 4,760 builder and associate members 50% of total prize money
