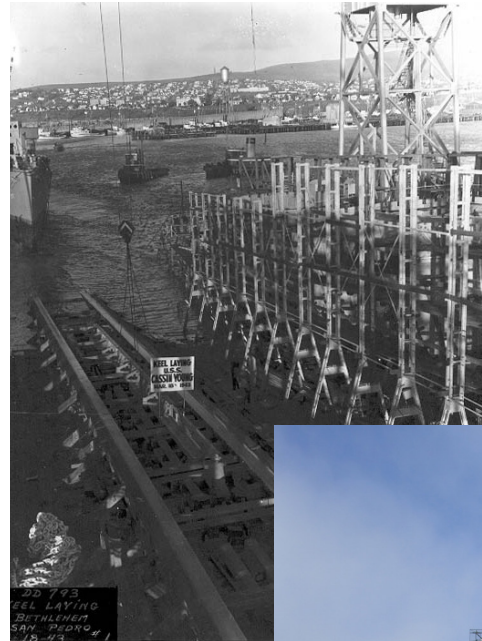
Commemorating the 75th Anniversary of World War II

1943: Turning the Tide

Join retired Park Ranger Vince Kordack to learn why the accomplishments of America's civilian workforce in 1943 were so important for laying the foundation for the Allied victory. Here in Boston, civilian workers at the Navy Yard built over 200 ships, including 14 Fletcher-class destroyers. On the other side the nation, workers at Bethlehem Steel in San Pedro, California, laid down, launched and commissioned USS *Cassin Young*—our own Fletcher-class destroyer still afloat today.
