

Progress Report on the Morganza Revitalization Project

The Morganza Revitalization movement is picking up momentum and moving in the right direction. Thursday, May 31, 2018, a meeting was held at St. Ann's CCD building for locals to share ideas on how to highlight Morganza's assets. It was a motivated group consisting of people who not only voiced their ideas, but also committed to take active roles. In addition to raising awareness, the group also plans to kick off a few fundraisers this fall to raise money that will go directly back in to the town.
