The U.S. Bishops' Pastoral Letter on Stewardship tells us "As Christian stewards, we receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly, share them lovingly in justice with others, and return them with increase to the Lord." Each month at our all-school assemblies, we will learn how to bring these teachings to life through the sharing of our gifts of time, talent, and treasure with others in our school, parish community, country, and world. Then, as classes we will set sail with our gifts to live these stewardship teachings 24/7/365. As St. Terese of Avila said, "Christ has no other hands but yours," and as Fr. Peter tells us, "...Christ expects us to use these gifts in the ways He Himself would use them, ...our hands becoming His in order to build up the Kingdom for the sake of the Church, for those who are in need."

## Here are our six characteristics - our "waves" - of an everyday stewards, adapted from Tracy Welliver:

MINDFUL Lives in the present, without baggage of the past, and without fear of the future.

To recognize that the call of Jesus can come at any moment to help someone in need from simple to profound ways, giving us sacred opportunities to live the Works of Mercy in real and sincere ways everyday.

**PRAYERFUL** Sees entire day as an opportunity to be in the presence of God. To know our God is always with us – in the all of the peace and chaos of our day!
