Project Guidelines

1. Choose a theme of the Catholic Social Teaching to highlight.

Life and the Dignity of the Human Person
Call to Family, Community, and Participation
Rights and Responsibilities
Option for the Poor and Vulnerable
The Dignity of Work and Rights of Workers
Solidarity
Care for God's Creation

2. Explain why you are passionate about sharing this theme with others.

3. Demonstrate how you will bring this theme to life.

What activity or service can be performed to minister this theme?

How can you get people excited about this theme?

4. Explain the lasting effects of your service activity.

How will this theme be carried forward, beyond the specific activity you propose? What do you hope participants and witnesses will gain from your activity?
