

How to Tweet @ Your SF Supervisor

Tweet @ your legislators to let them know the importance of ECE, especially during budget season!

1. Take a moment to think of one of the following:
 - o One reason ECE is important to you.
 - o Why you love working in ECE
 - o One issue you have faced while working in ECE:
 - Compensation
 - Housing
 - Can't find staff
 - Other
2. Write this down large on a piece of paper.
3. Take a picture of you holding the sentence. (If you have a twitter account and will be using it, take the picture on your phone. If not, take the picture on one of the SFCCPA devices).
4. **Tweet @ your legislator!** Use the iPad to tweet from the SFCCPA account, or tweet from your own! Press the feather icon in the upper right hand corner to start a tweet. Remind them to think about ECE during the upcoming budget decisions. See the legislators twitter accounts below.
 - o Make sure to press the camera icon to include your picture. Example tweet for a local legislator: *\$10M more for ECE! #ECESFbuzz*
 - o After the body of your tweet type @. After the @ type the twitter handle below for the Legislator you are sending. Your tweet should look like this: *\$10M more for ECE! #ECESFbuzz @twittername*. Make sure there is no space between the @ symbol and the twitter name!
 - o Use the hashtag: #ECESFbuzz so we can find these tweets and retweet them.
 - o Press tweet!
5. Next step? Write a letter to the editor next week telling them about the importance of ECE and incorporating your work today. We will email out more detailed instructions.

- o After the body of your tweet type @. After the @ type the below twitter handle of the Legislator. Your tweet should look like this:
\$800M more for ECE! #ECESFbuzz @twittername
Make sure there is no space between the @ symbol and the twitter name!
- o Use the hashtag: #ECESFbuzz so we can find these tweets and retweet them.
- o Press tweet!

5. Next step? Write a letter to the editor next week telling them the importance of ECE and incorporating your work today. We will email out more detailed instructions.
