They conduct street outreach to bring agency and program information to community members. They provide consumer referrals to people they encounter including pregnant and parenting women, fathers, and people without medical insurance. <p><b>2. Dominic Coppola, Information Technology Associate – Healthy Baby Network</b> – Dominic assists with the PeerPlace Network application. PeerPlace is a case management and referral tool used by Community Health Workers and outreach workers to conduct case management and make referrals in a more efficient manner. PPN is useful for record and prerequisite-keeping when making referrals. <p><b>3. Leah Kazmierski, Restoration Rochester</b> – Restoration Rochester helps people connect with resources in the community. They try to fill in the gaps and connect people with case managers, food banks, clothing closets, mental health care, and physical health care. Restoration Rochester also works with Crossroads Pregnancy Care under the CareNet umbrella. Crossroads Pregnancy Care helps pregnant and parenting moms and counsels them to choose life and full term pregnancy. They also offer abortion counseling if women do opt for abortion elsewhere.</p> <p>There will also be a backpack drive at Greece Assembly of God on August 24 from 5pm-8pm. It will take place on Wednesday, October 25 from 9am – 3pm at the Radisson Rochester Airport on Jefferson Road. Registration will be open soon and the cost is \$20 to register. The keynote speaker will be Dr. Jackie Campbell of John Hopkins University and she will conduct the Danger Assessment training. After the conference, each attendee will have the opportunity to become certified in the Danger Assessment training by completing an online test for an additional \$25 (typically online training and certification costs \$125).</p>

<p>pregnancy outcomes, better child health development, and improved self-sufficiency. The Partnership is free for women who are pregnant with their first baby and when they enroll they are connected with a registered nurse who supports and advises the mother through a healthy pregnancy and parenting experience. The mother also receives a case manager who will work with them from the prenatal stage until their child reaches the age of 2. Nurses can meet with clients anywhere, whether or not they have a home.</p> <p>They also make mental health referrals if necessary. Anyone can make a referral to NFP. 753-BABY.</p>	
<p><b>6. DeVon Medlock, Outreach Worker – Healthy Baby Network</b> – Refers mothers and fathers to various types of support services throughout Monroe County. <p><b>7. Jean Ann Kuryla – Lifetime Care</b> – Lifetime Care is a home visiting program that provides aid in any aspect of pregnancy, including: Medicaid application/eligibility, W.I.C. referral, health history, well visits, breastfeeding, referrals/coordination of other community care services. Referrals can be made by: oneself, doctor’s office, other community agencies (i.e. Pregnancy Care Center, W.I.C., and Planned Parenthood).</p> <p>After the baby is born they, they also check to make sure that the baby and mother are well and can refer them to other resources in the Wayne, Seneca, and Ontario counties if needed.</p>	<p><b>Jean Ann Kuryla</b>  315-331-7990</p>

<p>8. <b>Sheryl Palmeri, Manager &amp; Kate Pipes, Maternal Child Team – Lifetime Care</b> – The Maternal Child Team of Lifetime Care is a home visiting program that sees sick children up until the age of 18. Its purpose is to increase the knowledge of mothers about their sick children’s basic needs. Skills that are taught and/or provided include: IV hydration, monitoring of blood pressure, care for diabetes, care for asthma, jaundice level checks through a non-invasive meter, etc. They also provide physical and occupational therapy.          Doctor referral is necessary to be a part of the program. Any doctor can refer. Others can refer by contacting the mother’s social worker. <p>10. <b>Tami Divers, Community Health Worker, Healthy Neighborhood Program – Monroe County Health Department</b> – The Healthy Neighborhood Program is a free program that provides resources and educates home owners and residents about living safety to promote safer home life and improved overall health. The program provides to 14605, 08, 09, 11, and 21 zip codes.          Resources provided include a safety kit that contains: pail, smoke alarms, paper towels, cleaning supplies, fire extinguisher, carbon monoxide alarm, first aid kit.          Aid includes home visits to check smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
