<p>3. Leah Kazmierski, Restoration Rochester – Restoration Rochester helps people connect with resources in the community. They try to fill in the gaps and connect people with case managers, food banks, clothing closets, mental health care, and physical health care. Restoration Rochester also works with Crossroads Pregnancy Care under the CareNet umbrella. Crossroads Pregnancy Care helps pregnant and parenting moms and counsels them to choose life and full term pregnancy. They also offer abortion counseling if women do opt for abortion elsewhere.</p> <p>There will also be a backpack drive at Greece Assembly of God on August 24 from 5pm-8pm. Please let Deanna know if you are interested at tabling at this event and please help us spread the word!</p> <p>Our annual conference, Safe Mom = Safe Baby: Pregnancy, Violence, and Maternal Mortality will address domestic violence as a public health issue and its effects on maternal child health. It will take place on Wednesday, October 25 from 9am – 3pm at the Radisson Rochester Airport on Jefferson Road. Registration will be open soon and the cost is \$20 to register. The keynote speaker will be Dr. Jackie Campbell of John Hopkins University and she will conduct the Danger Assessment training. After the conference, each attendee will have the opportunity to become certified in the Danger Assessment training by completing an online test for an additional \$25 (typically online training and certification costs \$125).</p>

In regards to the Finger Lakes Children's Environmental Health Center, there are some resources including the Healthy Home DVD, Healthy Home booklet (available in English and Spanish). These resources are very basic for teaching families on what they can do to be healthy. She has a large storyboard display to lend to programs that teaches about lead in English and Spanish. The Mother to Baby program at the University of Rochester addresses environmental exposures for moms who are pregnant or planning to be pregnant or are breastfeeding. <p>9. Kathy Cummins – Crisis Nursery, Center for Youth – The Center for Youth offers school based programs, a community group home for moms and babies, and the Crisis Nursery. The Crisis Nursery is a shelter for babies when parents are in a crisis situation (daycare closed, mom is sick, etc.). The Crisis Nursery provides support for families through a variety of services including help with day care applications, job applications, and food vouchers. They help with respite, homeless, job interviews, school enrollment, navigating DSS, etc. in addition to watching the kids. Families can arrange care at the Crisis Nursery by calling and having a phone screening. The nursery will make sure they have staff available, schedule them, and ask them for information (confidential). A second Crisis Nursery is opening on Rosewood Terrace off of Culver Road. <p>10. Krysta Baccari, Health Educator - Jordan Health at Community Place – Krysta works at one of the 10 different Jordan Health sites, located at 145 Parsells Avenue on the third floor. Her focus is adolescents, ages 12-25. She provides preconception health, physicals, STD/HIV prevention, pregnancy testing, birth control, family planning counseling, and more. Jordan Health also has facilitated enrollers to help those without insurance. You can access any Jordan Health site – they are a one stop shop.
