Changes, Changes, Changes

It is said that nothing stays the same. In other words, change is a constant in our lives. Summer has changed to Fall. Students have changed from vacation to back-to-school. Baseball has mostly given way to football. Daylight Savings Time changes to Eastern Standard. The list could go on and on!

St. Paul's is also going through change as Pastor Chris and Kathy have now ended their tenure with us. Yes, we've been through this before, but, as in the past, it will again provide opportunity for reflection, renewal, and change!

So, what will be the imminent changes here at St. Paul's?

There will be several weeks with supply pastors leading our worship. During this time, we will be seeking a full-time interim pastor. Names of potential candidates will be

forthcoming from Penn Central Conference to be followed by an interview process. However, that scenario could also change if PCC desires to appoint an interim pastor for us.

Since much has changed within our congregation and community since the last Church Profile was completed, another one will need to be done. This will give prospective settled pastoral candidates the opportunity to determine if St. Paul's and the Manheim area is a church and community they would feel comfortable serving. A team (whose members will be announced following Church Council approval) will compile the information necessary for the profile. As members / friends of the church and residents of the community, your input into this report will be valued.

Changes, Changes, Changes

Following the completion of the profile, it will be made available throughout the UCC network. Pastors seeking a position and who feel that St. Paul's might be a good fit will then send their resumes to us. The Search Team (whose members will be announced following Church Council approval) will determine potential candidates to be interviewed. This step would also involve visits, when feasible, to hear them preach.

When the Search Team decides upon a suitable candidate, that person will preach in front of our congregation after which a vote will be taken to accept or reject the Calling.

One item that may not represent change is the amount of time needed for the entire process to play out. Those of you who have been with this church long enough know that past searches have taken as long as approximately two years!

Another is that we will continue, for the foreseeable future, with a single worship service beginning at 9:30. However, you might see some changes within the service.

There are times when change is good and times when perhaps it isn't. One thing that we cannot let change is our commitment to the success of St. Paul's as it strives to serve God, its congregation, and its surrounding community.

Change is NOW! Are you ready for it?

Church Council Highlights

Church Council met on September 19 @ 7 pm. Highlights of the meeting are:

Memorial Gifts & Endowment:

Eric Myers reported:

- \$2,000 has been faithfully submitted from the rental properties each month.
- In August, a deposit of \$11,375 was made which represents donation received from the congregation and gifts in memorial.
- \$939,381.01 is the value of the Endowment Fund as of August 31, 2017.
- Cash draw year to date is \$95,728 – this is as anticipated.

Treasurers Report:

Eric Myers reported:

- Operating current income for August was \$8,745 which is lower than expected – likely due to attendance.
- Operating Report – expenses are pretty much as expected.
- Agency Account report is now accurate to the best of our knowledge.

Pastor's Report:

As this was his last official council meeting, Pastor Chris would like to say thanks to the church leadership for being so supportive of he and Kathy, especially during the times of his illness.

Spiritual Council and Jim Haun held an exit interview with Pastor Chris just before the council meeting.

Committee Reports:

Farm Show: Ron Forry & Joe Raia have been working to find the best price on the pork bbq and the rolls to increase potential profits. Please sign up to serve during the week of October 9-13 – contact is Ron Forry.

Old Business:

A new kitchen manager position and job description was approved by council. Joe Raia was appointed to this new volunteer position. A Kitchen Use Agreement was also approved by council.

A new missions of the month list for 2018 was proposed. The new schedule reflects an attempt to balance giving in four main areas which is more in line with St. Paul's mission/vision: self (St. Paul's), community, church and/or denomination, and the world.

New Business:

Worship Recommendations: A draft order of worship was approved to use during the supply/bridge pastor time.

Council approved the recommendation from The Rev. Betsy Bruaw, Conference Associate Minister from Penn Central Conference, and Spiritual Council to move forward with securing a bridge pastor for the next 3-4 months and then appoint a pastor designated by the conference until our search team completes the call process for a settled pastor. An interim pastor would simply fill the pulpit, while a designated pastor would be chosen specifically to work through needs/issues with the congregation. This will help in determining the best fit for a candidate to be the settled pastor for St. Paul's.

Nominations and Budget Committees will be ramping up in October.

The Search and Profile Teams will be finalized and approved by council soon.

Council adjourned.

Thanks for your continuing support of the Food Pantry which serves families in the Manheim Central School District.

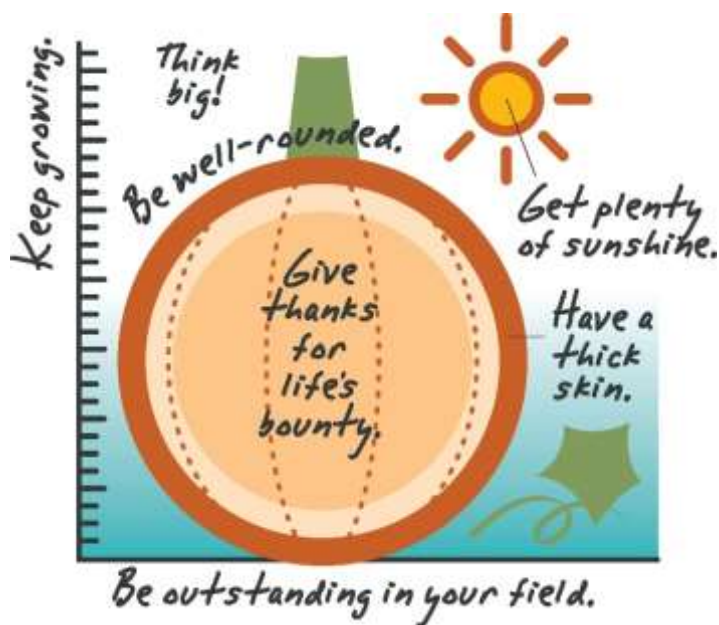

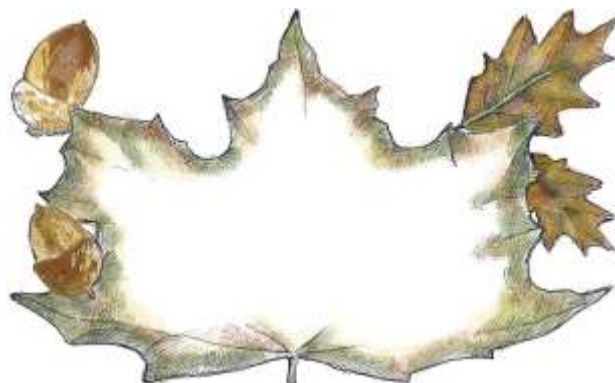

What's your rule?

J. Wilbur Chapman, a traveling evangelist in the late 19th century, practiced what he called a rule for Christian living: "Anything that dims my vision of Christ, or takes away my taste for Bible study, or cramps my prayer life, or makes Christian work difficult is wrong for me, and I must, as a Christian, turn away from it."

St. Paul offers similar advice — presented in positive terms — for Christians: "Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things" (Philippians 4:8, ESV).

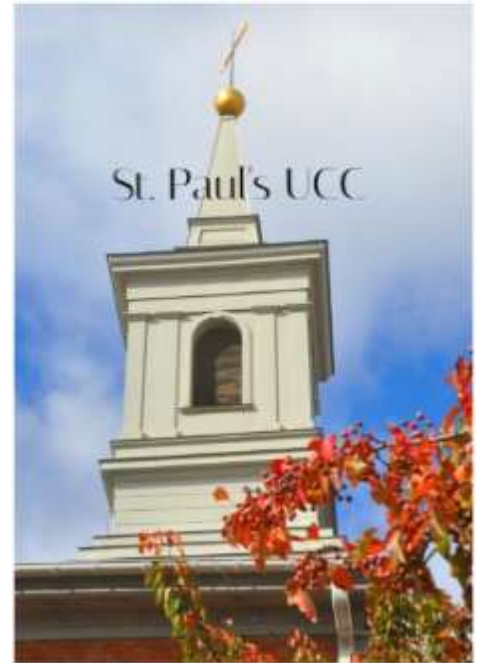
