Worship That Sizzles

The coming summer months at St. Paul's promise so many wonderful things: Creative sermons built around seasonal themes, great food, and sharing faith and love with one another in new and exciting ways. For some members, "new and exciting" may be an intimidating thought. What does new and exciting worship look like? How much is going to change, and will it take us beyond what we think it should be?

Perhaps it's time to examine what God says in His Word about the type of worship He wants.

There are many passages in Scripture about worship. Paul tells us how to worship God with our lives and actions in **Romans 12:1-2**. Moses teaches us to love God with all of our heart, soul, and strength in **Deuteronomy 6:5**. I think Jesus encapsulates true worship in the most profound way in **John 4:23-24**.

"But the hour is coming and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and

truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth."

How do we worship God in spirit and truth? Does it mean that we should only have service in one place? Does it mean that the music must only sound one particular way? Does it mean that everything has to be just perfect? While we strive to give God our very best of everything, worshiping Him has nothing to do with the location, style, or sequence of service.

1 Corinthians 3:16 reminds us that *believers* are the temple of God, not a physical location. God is alive in us! To truly worship in spirit, our whole hearts must be fully engaged. The flames of passion for God should ignite as we remember that He is the ruler and author of the Universe, the lover of our souls, our friend and comforter, our joy, our savior, and there is no one like Him, nothing He cannot accomplish. He is worthy of



Independence Day Lessons for Church Life

- **Return to the basics** — On July 4 we commemorate the origins of our country. In terms of faith, we also periodically need to hear again the foundational stories of Creation, the Israelites and, of course, Jesus.
- **Honor the gift of freedom** — “For freedom Christ has set us free ... do not submit again to a yoke of slavery” (Galatians 5:1, ESV). We strive as citizens to preserve and live out our national freedom. Likewise, as citizens of God’s kingdom we live gladly in the freedom of salvation and share that gift with others.
- **Enjoy community** — July 4 is known for picnics, parades and other community gatherings. Similarly, the church is nourished by coming together for worship, meals and other special events.
- **Be light in the darkness** — As fireworks brighten the sky with light and color, the church is called to display the Gospel’s unique light in a dark world. Our word *dynamite* and the Greek word for *power* — as in, “You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you” (Acts 1:8) — share a root. Through God’s power in us, we share Jesus — dynamically! — with others.





In *Springs in the Valley* (Zondervan), pioneer missionary Lettie Cowman tells of a traveler making a trek through an African jungle. Native tribesmen who helped carry loads walked rapidly on day one, covering a great distance. Yet the next morning they refused to move. When the frustrated traveler asked the tribesmen why they were just sitting, they said they'd gone too fast on the first day and "were now waiting for their souls to catch up to their bodies."

This summer, put your best foot forward by brightening up a pair of flip-flops.


What you need:


