## Advent

Very soon St. Paul's will begin the journey through Advent to Christmas. What is Advent about? Here are some meanings of the symbols used during this season:

*December 3<sup>rd</sup> marks the beginning of Advent.* Advent means: "Come, Lord Jesus" and is the season in which the Church expresses its longing for the return of Christ. Advent is the beginning of the church year.

*The color of Advent is purple.* Purple was an expensive dye used by kings. We use purple because Christ is our king.

*Advent lasts four weeks.* During those weeks we light one candle on the Advent wreath each week through the season. The candles stand for:

- ◆ Hope
- ◆ Peace
- ◆ Joy
- ◆ Love

- ◆ The 5<sup>th</sup> candle is the *Christ Candle* which we light on Christmas Eve.

On the Advent wreath there is one pink candle. Some call this the *Mary Candle*. When it comes time to light this candle, Pastor Long will tell you the real meaning of this strange candle.

On December 26 begins the *Twelve Days of Christmas*. You know: *On the first day of Christmas my true love gave to me...*

Oh well, if you come to Church on December 31<sup>st</sup>, I'll share with you what these days really mean!

From Cheri and I may Christ not only be born in Bethlehem but in all our hearts and lives. Amen.



**Almost Half Way Through School Giveaway** will be held during the Santa Breakfast. School supplies and hats, gloves, and scarves will be given away to families in need of these items.





Church Council met on Tuesday, November 21 @ 7 pm. Highlights of the meeting are:

## Memorial Gifts & Endowment:

Eric Myers reported:

- ◆ \$925,372.45 is the value of the Endowment Fund as of November 10, 2017.

## Treasurers Report:

Eric Myers reported:

- ◆ We've had a few months without an additional endowment draw - total drawn so far is \$121,000 of a possible \$169,000 approved by the congregation. No out of the ordinary expenses to note.

## Pastor's Report:

- ◆ 18 pastoral visits. More visits to be scheduled.
- ◆ Pastor's Office Hours are Tuesday-Friday 9 am-1 pm. (See Page 3 for more details.)

## Committee Reports:

- ◆ Property Board: A video doorbell has been installed for security purposes. Thanks to Ed Kopp for installing the doorbell. Budget discussions re: 2018 projects were held.

## Old Business:

- ◆ **2018 Budget**  
The Budget Committee presented a proposed 2018 budget for approval. Council approved the budget to be approved by the congregation at a **Congregational Meeting to be held on Sunday, December 10 following worship.** (See Page 2 for details).
- ◆ **State of the Church Meeting Review**  
Comments from the meeting were reviewed by all council members.

- ◆ Samaritan Counseling Center Church Assessment Forms need to be completed to begin the assessment. Feedback from council was received.
- ◆ Advent Fellowship  
New Voices & Women's Fellowship are in charge of this event. A clipboard will be passed in church to find volunteers re: decorations and the Salvation Army bell ringers

## New Business:

- ◆ Church Biography Review  
16 Responses were received. President Dave Ludwig summarized the comments which will also be shared at the Dec. 10 congregational meeting.
- ◆ Additions/Changes to Article 7 in Church By-Laws  
During a pastor's absence, our current by-laws do not stipulate who plans worship. Spiritual Council will be the entity to do so, but this needs to be added to the by-laws. Dave Ludwig will draft the proposed wording for December council approval and then January congregational approval.
- ◆ Election Board's use of Wi-Fi  
Council reaffirmed their stance of not sharing wi-fi use for outside groups.

## Open Discussion:

- ◆ Communion elements are to be covered.

The next council meeting will be held on Tuesday, December 19 @ 7 pm. The meeting adjourned.






# POP-UP CARD

Share the good news of Jesus' birth with this creative Christmas card.

**What you need:**

- Construction paper (two pieces, including one white)
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Pens
- Glue stick



**What you do:**

1. Neatly fold the white paper in half, short side to short side.
2. Draw two parallel lines (at least 2 inches apart) from the fold to about halfway to the edge. Cut along the lines.
3. Fold the cut section back and forth so it pops up.
4. Push the section up so it pops up inside the folded paper. Draw a nativity scene on the pop-up box.
5. Fold the colored paper in half, short side to short side. Place the white paper inside it and glue the white paper down, being careful not to glue the pop-up box.
6. Write a Christmas message and give or send the card to someone.




