through us. Let's maximize these chances to network with, and spread love to others by participating in youth and mission events. Your attendance and contributions **ARE** making a difference. Thank you ☺

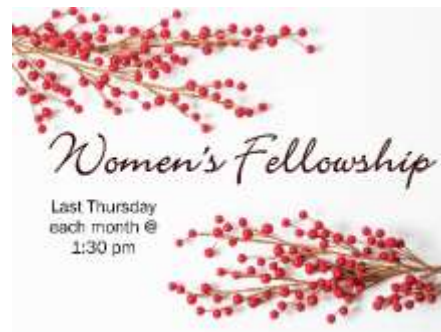

Church Council met on Tuesday, October 16

@ 7 pm. Highlights of the meeting include:

Memorial Gifts & Endowment:

Eric Myers reported:

- ◆ Endowment Fund value is \$962,210.13
- ◆ \$53,749.97 of the \$150,108 approved has been withdrawn so far this year

Treasurers Report:

Eric Myers reported:

- ◆ Benevolence: \$345 away from our annual pledge for OCWM (and it's only October!)
- ◆ Operating: income was received from Gail Ober's estate – this will soon be transferred to the Endowment Fund.
- ◆ Capital: \$12,536 has been received year to date. This is \$536 in income over the amount budgeted for the year.

Pastor's Report:

- ◆ No report

Committee Reports:

- ◆ Farm Show: Ron Forry reported that we sold more sandwiches this year, but our costs were higher as well. All in all, it was a good week.
- ◆ Property Board: Work on the air conditioning will be scheduled shortly.
- ◆ Pastoral Search Committees: The team consists of Lynn Brewer, Andy Ressler, Claire Reed, Karen Brandt and Dani Fair. The committee is meeting with The Rev. Dr. Monica Dawkins-Smith, conference minister and President of Penn Central Conference to go over questions re: process. Several candidates have already applied. The committee will continue to meet on the 2nd & 4th Mondays through the end of the year. Please keep this committee and this process in prayer.

Old Business:

- ◆ Altar & Pulpit Cloth Replacement: Discussion tabled until swatches arrive.

New Business:

- ◆ Council approved a proposal from Doceo Office Solutions for a Toshiba copier with an unlimited copies program.
- ◆ Council approved the development of a paid praise team leader position and job description for 2019.
- ◆ 2019 Budget: Eric Myers to contact staff members re: budgetary needs at their staff meeting on November 5. Additional funds will be needed for the Anniversary Committee, the praise team leader and a computer for a settled pastor.
- ◆ A State of the Church meeting was set for Sunday, November 11 following worship as well as the Annual Congregational Meeting for Budget approval on Sunday, December 9 following worship.

Open Discussion:

- ◆ Ron shared food inspection information with council and reiterated how important it is to follow safe food handling procedures in the church when serving food to the public.

The next council meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 20 @ 7 pm. The November Communion & Church Closer is Sandy Bareford.

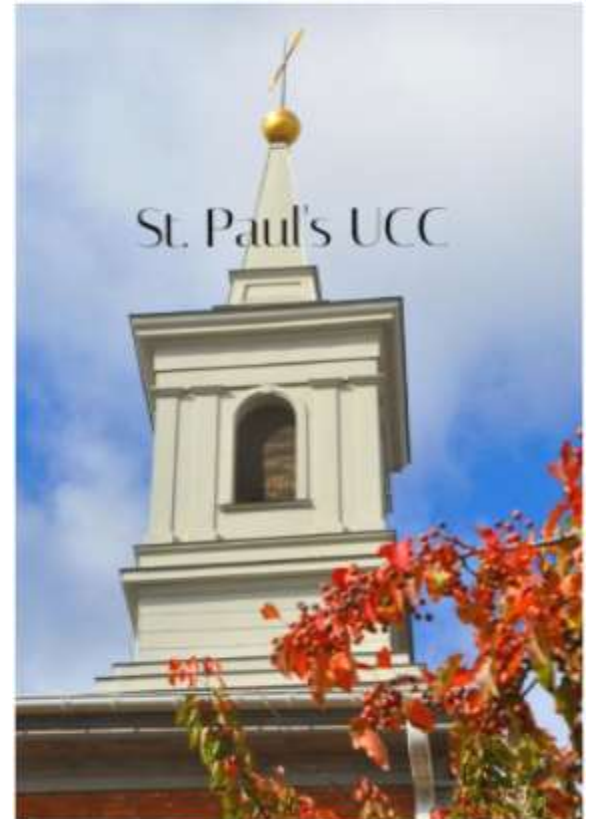
