So, we pray, attend, and serve. Why do we do this? From true faith what we do is for God's glory.


What is true faith?

Pastoral Search Update

According to the Council Highlights (page 8), it won't be long until the Profile Committee wraps up their work preparing the Church Profile to have available for potential candidates and the work of the Pastoral Search Committee will begin.

In this time, it is important for all of us to have this process wrapped in prayer as calling a pastor will only be successful if God works in the hearts and lives of the search committee, the leadership and congregation of our church and the pastor we will call.

Consider the example of Jesus. In Luke 6, Jesus went out to a mountainside to pray and spent the night praying to God. When morning came, he called his disciples to him and chose twelve of them. Without much prayer, our search committee will not achieve success. Oh, we may find someone, even someone the church can be excited about, but God will not be in unless there is work done by the Spirit in hearts.

In Matthew 9, Jesus tells his disciples that the harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. We can "*Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.*" Jesus challenged the disciples that the workers are few and that in response they ought to pray. His point applies today as gifted and qualified pastors are rare. The right strategy in the face of this need is for us to cry out to the Lord to do a work in hearts and beseech the Lord to send out a particular worker into the harvest field that is St. Paul's.

In calling a preaching pastor, our search committee will make hundreds, if not thousands of decisions. How often should we meet? How do we go about the process? Each of these decisions will require wisdom. Pray that God will grant it to our search committee, the church and potential candidates.

Finally, if we, the church is aware that people are really praying, there will be an increased confidence in the entire process of calling our pastor. In turn, this will convince our people in their hearts that this is God's choice for the church and they

will therefore, treat the new pastor accordingly.

Let us take the steps to immerse this process in prayer and to be disciplined about prayer. Below are some specific ways we can pray through this process:

Prayer for our search committee:

- Pray for patience to commit to God's timing.
- Pray that the search committee keeps an attitude that is the same as that of Christ Jesus (Philippians 2)
- Pray for wisdom to choose the right person (Romans 12)

Pray for our next pastor:

- Pray that God would increase this person's passion for preaching the Word of God.
- Ask God to begin to place a calling on this person's heart to serve @ St. Paul's UCC, Manheim.
- Pray for the next pastor's family. Pray that God, who knows who they are, would give them the strength as they consider leaving their current setting.

Pray for the people in our church:


- Pray for patience and that people will trust the leadership as the process takes place.
- Pray that the people would place a priority on biblical preaching. It is easy to gravitate to personality, programs or a particular age. Pray that, above all, we

would call a pastor who will proclaim the Word of God.

- Pray that we would not react to previous pastors, but to be open to the gifts and calling of the candidate.

Please feel free to Stay & Pray in the Sanctuary following worship on Sunday mornings.



Manheim Project Update

11 churches took part in the Manheim Project which took place during a two week period at the end of July. Approximately 150 house projects were completed in those two weeks. This was despite an exceptionally rainy week of July 23-27!

The projects included a wide range of work:

- ◆ Painting (interior & exterior)
- ◆ Cleaning
- ◆ Weeding
- ◆ Tree trimming
- ◆ Fenced installation
- ◆ Roofing
- ◆ Window & door repairs and replacements
- ◆ Ramps for handicap access
- ◆ Concrete work
- ◆ Many others

Nate Minnich from White Oak Church of the Brethren ably headed up the overall organization between all the churches. And Love INC in Lancaster handled the initial inquiries, not only for us in Manheim but for two other Lancaster County communities (Ephrata & Lititz). Sandy Bareford & Akira Owens were the coordinators for St. Paul's UCC.

Assistance Update from Manheim Ministerium

In the first 6 months of 2018, the following assistance has been provided to Manheim Families through the Manheim Ministerium:

- ◆ 195 calls received
- ◆ Assistance provided to 89 individuals/families
- ◆ Gas vouchers – 42
- ◆ Rent/security deposit – 36
- ◆ Groceries/gift cards – 26
- ◆ Gas & Groceries – 10
- ◆ Utilities – 15
- ◆ Water & Sewer – 5
- ◆ Heating/Fuel – 4
- ◆ Medical/Prescriptions – 3
- ◆ Furniture/Household – 3
- ◆ Handyman – 3
- ◆ Insurance – 3
- ◆ Transportation – 2
- ◆ Tax bill – 1
- ◆ Other requests – 3

(These are the requests that came with the calls, not everyone received actual assistance.)

Referrals were made to other organizations for those outside the Manheim Central area, most often to the United Way call number (2-1-1).

Only 2 people were homeless or facing eviction during this period.

A total of \$9,565.76 has been distributed over the first six months of 2018. The majority of that amount comes from the Manheim Churches Assistance Fund, but it also includes Salem Family Ministries, Salvation Army, and a few churches.

Council Highlights

Church Council met on Tuesday, July 17 & again on Tuesday, August 21 @ 7 pm. Highlights of the meetings include:

Memorial Gifts & Endowment:

Eric Myers reported:

- ◆ Endowment Fund value is \$958,910.26.
- ◆ \$34,583.31 of the \$150,108 approved has been withdrawn so far this year.

Treasurers Report:

Eric Myers reported:

- ◆ Capital: Income is almost at the yearly budget amount.
- ◆ Benevolence: OCWM income is coming in at \$100 over budget. Shepherd's Fund income was \$400 over budget.
- ◆ Operating: expenses for administration/benefits for full-time pastor are about \$30,000 under budget. All other income/expenses are as expected.

Pastor's Report:

- ◆ Council approved 4 days of paid vacation time for Pastor Bill.
- ◆ One baptism coming up in early fall.

Committee Reports:

- ◆ Farm Show Committee has begun preparations for the Farm Show Stand for October 8-12.
- ◆ Property Board: Received a quote from Rufus Brubaker re: air condition unit replacements.
- ◆ Self-Study: The results of the CAT survey are being used in the profile with both demographic info as well as emotional responses. Hearth & Home, looking for a shepherd to lead the congregation, looking for a relational pastor that is a good preacher seem to be the themes throughout the answers in the profile. Gretchen shared that the first draft of the church profile is done and has been sent to Penn Central Conference for review. Next step is to incorporate PCC's feedback, and then present the profile to council for approval.

Old/New Business:

- ◆ Altar & Pulpit Cloth Replacement: The green paraments need to be replaced. Pam and Dani have been investigating options and an anonymous donor will likely cover the cost.
- ◆ Air Conditioning: Council agreed with Property Board's decision to suggest two units be replaced at the congregational meeting on Aug. 26. Payment options would include using the capital funds to basically swap out the stained-glass windows for the air conditioning in the budget as the windows likely won't be done until next year.
- ◆ Pastor-Parish Resource Committee: Council agreed to establish a PPRC to support the pastor and his/her call to the church. Pastor Bill suggested that the pastoral search team could act as the committee now and for the first six months once a settled pastor is called. The future PPRC would be a process that the settled pastor would appoint.
- ◆ Membership Issue: For the newsletter, birthdays and anniversaries listings will only include active members in good and regular standing and in 2019 the status of current members is to be determined.
- ◆ Council regretfully accepted the resignation of Ruth Raia from council and the pastoral search committee. Council will need to reappoint someone for the remainder of Ruth's council term and vice presidency.
- ◆ VBS Recap: VBS was great – 15 children attended!

The next council meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 18 @ 7 pm.



Living Sacrifices

In Romans 12:1, Paul urges Jesus' followers to perform spiritual worship by being "a living sacrifice." For Old Testament believers, that concept would have been an oxymoron. A sacrifice, after all, required bloodshed and death to absolve sins.

New Testament believers — us included — may squirm at the idea too. "The problem with a living sacrifice," as D.L. Moody noted, "is that it keeps crawling off the altar."

Living for Jesus is an all-in commitment. Being a living sacrifice involves forsaking the world and our own desires. But through God's grace and Jesus' sacrificial love, we can alter our attitude and stay on the altar.




