- The development of a First Nations National Housing and related Infrastructure Strategy.
- The creation of new systems, new housing institutions and new ways to deliver housing services to First Nations.
- Identifying effective ways to leverage investments and finding new ways to finance housing and related infrastructure.
- Identifying skills and capacity needs to support the transition process.
- Sharing of best practices.
