

ROBERT J. MARTINEAU, J.D.

Distinguished Research Professor of Law Emeritus

Robert J. Martineau of Nokomis, Florida, is Distinguished Research Professor of Law Emeritus, University of Cincinnati. He is a graduate of University of Chicago Law School, where he was an associate editor of the University of Chicago Law Review.

Among the public positions he has held are Assistant Attorney General of Maryland; Circuit Executive of the US Court of Appeals for the 8th Circuit, and Executive Officer of the Wisconsin Supreme Court.

Mr. Martineau's experience in the field of constitutional revision includes: Maryland Constitutional Convention Commission, member, secretary, and chair of the Judiciary committee (committee prepared 600 page report including a draft constitution); Secretary, Maryland Constitutional Convention; Drafter, constitutional amendments on selection and tenure of judges for three state bar associations; Drafter, American Bar Association Model Judicial Article for State Constitutions, and Drafter, Drafting Guidelines, Partnership for Revising Florida's Constitution.

Mr. Martineau has written three books on drafting laws (including constitutional provisions) and rules in plain English, as well as law review articles on constitutional reform.

He has taught courses on state and local government and constitutional law and legislation and legislative drafting.
