

“God Can Do Whatever He Wants and We Love It”


Isn't once enough? Seriously! The year was 1994 and it was a beautiful Sunday morning in West Concord, MN. When I was at church making last minute preparations on my message, I received a phone call from my wife (Karen) that no one wants to hear. In a panic Karen said, “Pat, come home now. Scott's (our 14 year old son) in trouble!” I ran across the street to the parsonage wondering what I was going to find. After I leaped nearly two flights of steps to his upstairs bedroom, what I saw was something I will never forget. My son was lying lifeless in the arms of his mother and there was blood everywhere. My heart just stopped. What has happened? It turns out my son had many grand mal seizures during the night and he had chewed on his tongue in distress. There was a very quick ambulance ride to a hospital in Rochester, MN. After a thorough examination by the doctors, we heard the dreaded words, “Mr. and Mrs. Phinney, we are sorry to tell you that your son has cancer and we have to move fast to save his life.” Our world turned upside down. Things seemed to go dark for me, as I processed this news. How can this be? My precious, energetic and vivacious son was only 14. This diagnosis set us on a six-month journey that has not been forgotten in our home. To this day, we will talk about how God miraculously healed our son and gave him a renewed life. What we saw in those painful months was more than I have the time to share, but know this . . . God showed Himself powerfully.

Once wasn't enough! On September 2, we heard the dreaded words again from doctors. This time it was my dear wife, Karen. Sitting in ER that day, our lives rocked again. It was cancer. Karen was diagnosed with stage three ovarian cancer that had metastasized in her abdomen. They found several very large tumors around vital organs and we had to move quickly to save her life. She has had two chemo treatments now and is experiencing typical reactions to a drug that God will use to bring healing in this beautiful woman. The plan is that she will probably have one or possible two more treatments. Next, she will have major surgery to remove any lingering tumors, along with a hysterectomy around Thanksgiving or mid-December. After she recovers for a month, then there will be three more chemo treatments throughout the winter. During this painful time again, we are seeing the same from God. He is showing Himself powerful.
