


Anglican Bishop J. C. Ryle of Liverpool is an interesting character to say the least. In his day, heresies abounded, the Anglican church was getting too far away from the Bible, and leaning towards Catholicism. *Popular holiness teachers—such as William Edwin Boardman, Robert Pearsall Smith, and his wife, Hanna Whitall Smith—urged Christians to embrace a superior form of spiritual life that included a second conversion experience, full salvation, and deliverance from all known sin in this life* [Ben Rogers, *The Gospel Coalition*]. Bishop Ryle was a faithful, and prolific writer of pamphlets, and tracts addressing the ills and evils of his day always from a solid Biblical foundation. 




The delightful and family friendly film on the early days of Dolly Parton, and a special coat made by her mother at a very low point in her life.
