At Progressive Arts Alliance, Grahovac will lead a team of both seasoned and young professionals, including several new additions to the staff, that bring the education and artistic expertise needed to positively impact students, teachers, and the way education is delivered.

“I’m excited to join the Board and staff of Progressive Arts Alliance to build on its wonderful history, further its mission and impact, and lead the organization through its next phase of development,” said Grahovac. “The focus of the organization’s integration of the arts into other subject areas emphasizes the learning process as well as outcomes.”

A resident of Elyria, Ohio, Grahovac received a Master of Arts in Art Therapy from Ursuline College (Pepper Pike, Ohio) and a Bachelor of Fine Arts from Columbus College of Art and Design (Columbus, Ohio).
