ACI Comments at Pesticide Review Board

Mark Shublak attended the Indiana Pesticide Review Board public hearing on Thursday, July 6 to provide comments on behalf of ACI. The board was hearing comments on a proposed rule to expand the list of state restricted use pesticide products to include certain herbicides containing the active ingredient dicamba. Mark provided oral and written testimony about ACI's position on dicamba expressing concerns about the product but suggesting there is not enough evidence to support the proposed rule at this time. Senate panel approves USDA funding bill

The Senate Committee on Appropriations on Thursday approved a funding bill for U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) programs, including a provision that would change how cotton is recognized under the commodities title of the farm bill.

The [FY2018 Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Appropriations bill](#) designates cotton as an "other oilseed" under Title I of the 2014 Farm Bill, allowing cotton producers to participate in the Price Loss Coverage (PLC) program along with other major U.S. crops.

The bill provides \$145.4 billion in discretionary and mandatory funding, \$4.85 billion more than the president's budget request and \$7.9 billion less than the FY2017 enacted level. It contains \$20.525 billion in discretionary funding, \$352 million below the FY2017 enacted level, and includes \$124.9 billion in mandatory funding.

Trump nominates USDA leaders

President Donald Trump announced this week his intent to nominate Ted McKinney as USDA's undersecretary for trade and foreign agricultural affairs and Dr. Sam Clovis as undersecretary for research, education and economics.

In May, Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue created the new position of undersecretary for trade and foreign agricultural affairs as directed by the 2014 Farm Bill.

McKinney has been director of the Indiana State Department of Agriculture since being appointed to the post in 2014 by then-Gov. Mike Pence. The NGFA and North American Export Grain Association in December jointly recommended to President Trump and Vice President Pence that McKinney be nominated to a high-level USDA post. Prior to his appointment as Indiana's ag director, he spent a decade with Dow AgroSciences, culminating in his service as its leader of food chain, agriculture industry affairs and state government relations.

Agriculture Secretary Sonny Perdue praised both selections. In a press statement, he said of McKinney: "I have always said that I want someone who wakes up every morning asking how we can sell more American agricultural products in foreign markets. Ted McKinney is that person. His longstanding background in agriculture, economic development and global issues will make him an unapologetic advocate for U.S. products in the world marketplace."

Increase in Gasoline License Tax, Special Fuel License Tax & Motor Carrier Surcharge Tax

2017 requires the Indiana Department of Revenue to publish the new rates effective **July 1, 2017**, for the gasoline license tax (IC 6-6-1.1-201), special fuel license tax (IC 6-6-2.5-28), and motor carrier surcharge tax (IC 6-6-4.1-4.5) on the department's Internet website no later than June 1, 2017. For the period July 1, 2017, to June 30, 2018, the following rates shall be in effect:

Gasoline license tax:	\$0.28/gallon
Special fuel license tax:	\$0.26/special fuel gallon
Motor carrier surcharge tax:	\$0.21/surcharge gallon
