President's Report

Community Cleanliness

- There was a major party in the Pines this weekend and there was litter strewn throughout the community.
- FIPPOA needs a campaign that targets the population that comes to the Pines for just one day.
- FIPPOA has tried to reduce the number of posters on the telephone poles.
- One such attempt was to institute the electronic bulletin board.
- Some posters are for events that are not in the Pines.

PAC Fundraisers

- Neil Foley is next Saturday, August 20th at the home of Henry Robin and Bob McGarity from Noon to 1:30
- Ed Romaine is on September 9th at Sip n' Twirl at 1pm.
- Both events will be promoted to the membership.

Building Department

- Received an email from 422 Ocean saying that a new building inspector had been out and informed them that fences are required around their pool.
 - FIPPOA can only serve as advisors to homeowners on zoning issues.
 - FIPPOA does not act as intermediaries with the Town

FIMI Project

- Contract 3.B.1 will be the first that relates to the Pines.
- This contract includes the removal of houses, decks and pools.

- Gail Lolis of Suffolk County is not generally releasing plans until the County also has the appraised values; if individual owners want to see the plans, they can call Lolis.
- There are two decks that were left destroyed by Hurricane Sandy and have remained in place since the storm:
 - There is an application in at the building department to repair one.
 - The second will be cleaned up by FIMI.

MAC

- Kent Dillon was injured in an accident when the Mobility Access Cart hit the new electrical platform in the harbor.
 - Volunteers (as well as passengers) are covered under our insurance.
 - FIPPOA Will notify the Town of the narrow passageway the electrical platform creates and that there was an accident there.
 - There may be an opportunity to address the size and location of the electrical platform as the second phase (freight dock) begins in the Fall.

Roncalli Lawsuit

- The lawsuit with Roncalli Freight continues slowly.
 - Depositions have been delayed.
 - We are asking how Coastline calculated their \$1M damages claim.

Membership

Gary Clinton, Membership Chair, reported:

- Membership is doing extremely well.
 - There are 392 members, as against a total of 370 at the fall meeting last year.
 - The committee will be redoing the membership brochure next year.
