Recycle Your Shoes" Fundraiser

Please bring your gently used pairs of shoes to the meetings to donate. Shoes must be a pair and no flip flops, Crocs, slippers or winter boots can be accepted. The Conservation CSP will have a collection box on the front porch for every meeting. Please ask your friends and co-workers to donate their shoes too.

We will be collecting shoes through a shoe-recycling fundraiser in partnership with Community Recycling. Community Recycling's ShoeBox Recycling program recycles gently used shoes for reuse. The Conservation CSP will collect shoes that will find new owners around the world. From South America and Africa to areas right here in the United States, the recycled shoes will go to help people and communities in over 50 countries.

Through ShoeBox Recycling's SoleMate Note initiative, recyclers are urged to "include a "SoleMate" note along with their recycled shoes telling their shoes' new owner where they came from, what they were used for, or even any special memories attached to them. In return, the recipient can write back to complete the SoleMate connection.

Community Recycling is proud to be a for-profit recycler of shoes. They have flipped the recycling triangle upside down and have mastered the most powerful 'R'—REUSE. With over 300 million pairs of reusable shoes hitting landfills each year, they are looking to change the way people think about their shoes. Questions? HOME LIFE CSP

For those of you who were interested in recipe for Autumn Apple Salad from our Homecoming meeting ,it is as follows:

1[20-oz] can crushed pineapple, undrained
 2/3 cup sugar
 1[3-oz] box lemon flavored gelatin [we used orange]
 1[8-oz] package cream cheese, softened & creamed
 1 cup apples, unpeeled & diced
 1/2 cup pecans, chopped
 1/2 cup celery
 1 cup whipped topping

Mix pineapple and sugar. Boil for 3 minutes. Add gelatin and cream cheese to hot mixture. Mix well. Let cool. Fold in apples, pecans, celery and whipped topping. Put in a 9x13-inch dish and chill for several hours. Makes 12 servings
