April Guest Speaker: Sonya Lee Barrington

Lecture: "Show and Tell"



Sonya Lee Barrington began using the medium of quilts as her means of expression in 1968. She has been in many solo and group exhibits, both juried and invitational. A sought after teacher and lecturer on her subject, her teaching has brought her to Australia and New Zealand as well as all parts of the United States.

She was juried in as a Master Member of Baulines Craft Guild in 1985. It is a California based non-profit association dedicated to the advancement of fine craft through education and the preservation of the craft legacy within contemporary culture.

Sonya Lee Barrington produced a line of hand-dyed and textured fabrics which she used in her work and now concentrates on very graphic bold patchwork using Silk Dupioni and a large body of both functional and decorative work which uses Repurposed/Recycled Wool.

President's Message – If You Build It, They Will Come

I always help set our guild's show up, because *I like* to do it. We have a completely new venue this time, but building our quilt show in empty, echoing, rooms, always reminds me of that Iowa cornfield that was transformed into a baseball diamond in the movie *The Field of Dreams*. "If you build it, they will come..." It's hard to believe, when you get there on Friday morning, that there will be a full-blown Quilt Show up before nightfall. But somehow it always works out, and they *will* come.

Think about why we go through the work to make our Quilt Show happen. In one way, it comes down to "fortune and glory" - we do it to earn money for the Guild and to show others what we can do with fiber and thread. In another way, it all comes back to the deep down reasons we make quilts in the first place. Somehow, whenever I make a quilt, it connects me with all the quilt makers, living or dead, who have influenced me. When I start to stitch, I can see the faces of my Mother and Grandmother, and feel back home again. I can hear the voices of quilting teachers in my head as I work and somehow, they live in my sewing room and guide my hands. I get the same kind of feeling as the frames go up and quilts are put upon them.

I'm almost certain the spirits of quilters, dead and gone, wander through the aisles the night before the show begins, just like those baseball heroes did in the cornfield. I can almost see them, fingering the fabrics in the vendor stalls, checking out the quilt backs and bindings, and inspecting labels. I can almost hear them say: "Well! In *my* day we *never* would have put pink and purple together!" or "Maisie, look at those tiny stitches!", "I *do* believe she painted on that quilt!", "My, my, where *did* she find that paisley print?, I've got to get me some of *that*!". I'm practically positive we could see and hear them if we tried.

So, we do it. We take our energy, our hearts and hands, our skills and time, and we put it all together in one great Show for all the quilters - past, present and future - to enjoy. It is a celebration of our craft, our growth as artists and caring human beings. It is a celebration of our diversity - one great big charm quilt of all the interwoven, vibrant colors of the personalities that make up our guild. It is a celebration of the loving hands in hard times, the continuance of the thread. We made the quilts and built our Show, and - good Lord willing and the creek don't rise - they *will* come...especially since wine is involved. Make sure you are part of it all, the building and the sharing, the work and the glory, the idea and the reality. We are the quilters. We are the piecers of dreams.

June 11, 2017 Linda Wagner “Gidgets and Gadgets”



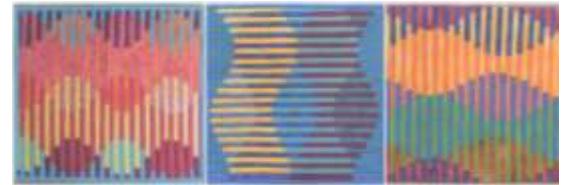
Techniques, techniques and even more techniques.

QUILT RECEIVING – Members are to drop off their quilts from April 15th to April 19th at one of the receivers listed below. Please call ahead to confirm they are open & receiving. Your quilt must have a 4” sleeve and the quilt identification label attached to the lower left back of the quilt. The other half of the label is your receipt. The quilt receiver will sign your receipt and return it to you. You will need to present your receipt(s) on Sunday for quilt return.

DELIVERY of Raffle Baskets, Marketplace items for sale, and Décor and Props to the Robert Livermore Community Center will be Friday, April 21 between 12 noon and 1:00 pm.

QUILT RETURN will be Sunday April 23rd from 5:15 to 6:00 pm. Only volunteer workers will be allowed in the building between 4:00 and 5:15 pm. Make sure you have your receipt. If someone else is picking up your quilt, make sure they have your receipt. If someone other than a guild member is picking up your quilt, they will be asked for ID and phone and will sign off on the receipt. We will not be rushing this process to ensure that all quilts are accounted for and get to their correct owners.

Guest Passes will be available at the April guild meeting. When you pick up your quilts on Sunday evening, you will be asked to pay for any of your guests who attended the show. **Discount Tickets for Volunteers** will be available at the April guild meeting for \$5. Then you won't need to wait in line at the show. Also, all volunteers with wristbands will be given coupons for free wine tasting.

QUILT KITS AVAILABLE

Please stop by the Community Quilts table to pick up a kit to quilt. Our kits include a quilt top, batting, backing, fabric for the binding and a label. The kits vary in size from baby to adult and the dimensions of the quilt are shown on the front of the kit so you know what you are taking. There is no deadline for returning the completed project. Also, if you take a kit and want to leave the binding to someone else, just return it after quilting and the committee will pass it along for binding. These kits have been very popular and are a good opportunity to practice your machine or longarm quilting.

NEW COMMUNITY QUILTS CHAIR

The current Community Quilts chairs will finish their terms soon and a new chairperson is needed. This position can be shared as it has been this past year. This very rewarding position has so much support from our AVQ members. The position of Community Quilts chair receives the donated quilts at the monthly meetings.
