Lecture: Telling Stories Workshop: Free Form Piecing

Sondra grew up in New York City, the imaginative child of European immigrants. Every summer, she was sent to stay with relatives abroad spending her time immersed in the historical landscapes of France, Hungary, Italy and Switzerland. Her surroundings gave life to the stories she read from Cinderella to The Three Musketeers. Today Sondra visits castles in Europe and museums in New York, preferring the 16th and 17th century paintings in the Louvre and the Met in NYC. “Free Form Piecing” Free form piecing is a no-template method of making unique multiple blocks that will fit together for a whole quilt. A great way to feature scraps and favorite novelties.

Remember your quilt will not look like this –this is just a sample

January 14th Jenifer Dick – Exploding 9 patch



Jenifer offers tips, hints and alternate techniques while teaching you how to make this four-block sampler quilt. Participants are guaranteed to learn something new and have fun stitching this stunning optical illusion quilt! This top will be completed in class.



March 11th Peggy Martin Jelly Roll Jive:

Dig out that Jelly Roll that perhaps you purchased on a whim and now you have the perfect way to use it with Jelly Roll Jive – These simple, fast strip-pieced blocks make a contemporary positive-negative design. Use busy prints for a softer look, or solids for more graphic impact.



April 15th Christine Barnes - Luminosity

This dazzling special effect is surprisingly easy to achieve, once you understand a few simple concepts: When you surround a relatively small area of warm, intense color with a larger area of cooler, less-intense, darker color, your quilt will appear to glow, as if light and warmth are coming from behind.

We begin with a crash course in color, followed by evaluation of your fabrics to ensure success. Then you'll begin cutting and piecing your blocks. Along the way, I'll have lots of tips for making the process easier and more accurate. I'll also go over how to cut and attach the "spinning" borders.

Community Quilts

Wanted: Mid and Long Armers to quilt some community Quilts. CQ has several quilt kits that need to be quilted. Please stop by the Community Quilts table to pick up a kit to quilt. Our kits include a quilt top, batting, backing, fabric for the binding and a label. The kits various sizes - baby to adult and the dimensions of the quilt are shown on the front of the kit so you know what you are taking. There is no deadline for returning the completed project.

We received **39** quilts in October. Community Quilts will accept quilt tops at this time. In addition, Community Quilts will accept quilt tops and backs. Be sure that your backing is at least 8-10 inches bigger than the quilt top.

Community Quilts needs to receive 150 quilts by November in order to be able to distribute 400-500 quilts for various agencies in December! Community Quilts is in need of completed quilts for Adult Males and Females, Teen Male and Female, Child Male and Female.

Please return all quilts that you took to add labels and/or binding at the November meeting. These quilts are needed for the December distribution. Thank you.

Special thank you to James Kervin for donating his late wife's quilting fabric – three big bins worth!!!
