

The Granby Land Trust invites artists to submit original work, including but not limited to painting, photography, printmaking, drawing, and sculpture, to its 12th annual juried art show, to be held October 26 – November 26, 2017, at the Lost Acres Vineyard Art Gallery in North Granby, CT.

Works should be inspired by New England's natural beauty. All genres of visual art are encouraged, including but not limited to landscapes, botanicals, still-lifes, portraits, and abstract art. Works must not have been previously exhibited in the GLT Art Show.

Artists are asked to identify 1) the property or place that inspired their work; and 2) the town and state in which the property is located (must be located in New England -- CT, RI, MA, VT, NH, ME). Properties do not have to be preserved to be eligible. All works will be juried for entry and awards. Some awards carry stipulations (for example, to be considered for the Granby Land Trust Award, the work must be inspired by a Granby Land Trust property.) Please see the list of awards for further stipulations.

2D artists are limited to **(2) entries - 36 inches or smaller** on any side. Limit does not include frames or mats. Painted-edge canvases are OK. Please have your work wired and ready for hanging. No saw tooth hangers or clip mountings will be accepted.

3D artists are limited to **(2) entries**. Free-standing art must stand on a base of no greater than 18" x 18" and be no taller than 6'. Sculpture on pedestals must sit on a pedestal no bigger than 18" x 18".

Please provide your own pedestals. Jewelry or similar items must include a presentation case or display.

ENTERING YOUR WORK:

Entry Pre-Registration: Save \$5 by **pre-registering** your entries.

Simply mail your registration form, with payment, by October 16 (see Registration Form below).

Entry Fees: For entries **pre-registered by mail**, a non-refundable fee of

Pick-Up Date for Declined Works: Thursday, October 26 from 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM sharp – no exceptions or Saturday, October 28, from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM at Lost Acres Vineyard.

Artists' Paint Out: Sunday, September 24, at the home/property of Al and Helen Wilke at 124 Higley Road in West Granby, CT (a portion of this property is protected by a conservation easement donated by the Wilkes). Paint Out will start at 8AM; complimentary continental breakfast will be available. General public will be invited to walk the property from 10:00 - 12:00PM to see artists' progress.



Opening Reception: Thursday, October 26, Lost Acres Vineyard, from 5:00 PM to 8:00 PM. Awards will be presented at the Opening.

Art Talk: Thursday, November 9, Lost Acres Vineyard, from 7 PM to 9 PM, co-hosted by Laura Eden and Bill Simpson. A number of artists will discuss their works and the inspirations behind them. Light refreshments will be served.

Pick-up Dates for Accepted Works: Sunday, November 26, from 2:00 PM to 5:00 PM and Monday, November 27, from 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM.

Sales: All work must be available for sale. 60% of sales will be returned to the artist with the remainder of the proceeds to benefit the Granby Land Trust and to support the event.


