Ask yourself these questions in the "I" and "we" forms:

Questions to Consider About MPUUC's History and your/our relationship to it:

*How do I feel about what happened? ...and...

*How much of what I feel about a particular event in MPUUC's history is actually about that event, and how much is actually about other things in my own past or current issues in my life rather than the event at MPUUC?

*What keeps me and our congregation from change, from transformation?

*What do I need to do to come to some greater degree of closure on the past, to put the past in proper perspective?

*Am I willing to let go of those parts of the past that need to be released for my own good and the good of Mission Peak?

Questions to Consider about MPUUC, throughout the Interim Period and beyond:

*What do we love?

*What do we really want?

*What are we ready to give up?

*What are we called to do?

*Who are our partners in answering that call?

*How shall we be with our partners?

*What is the story we are enacting?

*What are the full dimensions of that story?

*How does this story end?

*How is the divine at work in this work we do?

For the work of the congregation, which is weaving a tapestry of love we call community, let us be in discernment.
