

## **HCCI Essential Elements of Home-Based Primary Care™ Classroom Workshop Agenda**

### **Workshop Description:**

The HCCI Essential Elements of Home-Based Primary Care™ classroom workshop is a two-day (twelve hours) highly interactive, discovery-driven learning experience. The goal of the workshop is to teach HCCI's approach to home-based primary care – based on the latest thinking and experience from national experts – from both a clinical and practice management perspective. The case-based sessions will focus on clinical and economic factors unique to home-based primary care to include patient assessment; medication management, infection control, coding and billing, staffing and reimbursement models.

### **Workshop Objectives:**

Upon completion of this educational activity, participants will be able to:

- Describe the role of HBPC in various contexts, including Population Health, Public Health, and the developing systems of healthcare.
- Apply the American Geriatric Society's (AGS) Guiding Principles in the approach to the care of people with multi-morbidities in the home setting.
- Provide optimal patient care in a simulated home setting.
- Examine and discuss the business models, economic drivers, and quality indicators for HBPC and their impact on care delivery.

<b>Session 1 – Foundational Principles</b> <i>Focus:</i> The business case for home-based primary care, based on the five guiding principles for care of older adults with multi-morbidity.
<b>Session 2 – Economics</b> <i>Focus:</i> Contrasting case studies reveal best practices for building a sustainable home-based primary care practice.
<b>Session 3 – Clinical Care</b> <i>Focus:</i> The clinical management of homebound/mobility limited patients with complex medical conditions, done in the context of the patient's goals, risk, benefits, cost and prognosis.

<b>Session 5 – Welcome and Day 1 Review</b>
<b>Session 6 – Personal Safety and Self-care</b> <i>Focus:</i> The characteristics of a successful home-based primary care provider. The traits and skills such as resilience, setting boundaries, and practicing true empathy unique to being a home-based primary care provider and maintaining a healthy practice.
<b>Session 7 – Operations</b> <i>Focus:</i> The preferred model for home-based primary care is one that allows for an interdisciplinary team. The composition of care teams is highly unique for each practice, and includes caregivers, family members, and community resources. Technology for operational support of a home-based primary care practice.
<b>Session 8 – Putting It All Together</b> <i>Focus:</i> The processes important to managing an efficient and effective home visit. Conducting three simulated house calls.
<b>Session 9 – Emergency Intervention</b> <i>Focus:</i> The role of the home-based primary care team in emergency response and preparedness for homebound patients; avoiding unnecessary hospitalizations.
