Updates from Gary Green of ISBE

Many of you have inquired about the **Application for Recognition and Calendar in IWAS** as you need access to that system in order to renew your recognition for 2017-18. I regret that the system is still unavailable to you. A number of changes needed to be made to incorporate new understandings of some requirements and new requirements. We are testing these changes to ensure that the software will work for you all once this system is live. We started with a baker's dozen last week but are down to just two now...but one of those two is proving resistant to fixing. Your patience is appreciated. Once it opens, the system will be open for at least a month, so you should have plenty of time to do your renewal.

As you all probably know, there is a new **tax credit provision** to assist parents of nonpublic school students (35 ILCS 40—Invest in Kids Act). The details of how this program will be implemented are still being worked out. This is a little more complicated than is usually the case with nonpublic school matters because this program requires coordination between the Illinois State Board of Education and the Illinois Department of Revenue. I suspect that Revenue will be the primary source of information in the long run, but I will try to let you know things as I learn them.


Administrative rules in both agencies must be updated and other work accomplished, so you will want to monitor publications by both agencies if you are interested in the progress on this matter. To this end, amendments for Part 425 (Voluntary Registration and Recognition of Nonpublic Schools), recently reviewed by ISBE, are now available for public comment. The proposals and a summary of the issues involved are available under Proposed Rules and Amendments. The public comment period ends December 18. Because of the requirements of the rulemaking process, I cannot comment on the content of the rules, so please do not ask me about that. Instead, submit any comments or suggestions to rules@isbe.net.

Last year, a question arose regarding the **reporting of race and ethnicity** for students in our forms for registration of nonpublic schools. Specifically, a school contacted me wondering how to include students who either do not know what race/ethnicity they are or decline to specify a racial/ethnic identity. I finally heard back from our Data Governance Committee this week (government sometimes works slowly!) that they have decided to remain with the categories established for federal reporting (https://www2.ed.gov/policy/rschstat/guid/raceethnicity/index.html), so if you have a student who falls into the does not know/declines to specify group, the person completing the registration document for the school must choose on behalf of the student. If any of you need to revise your registration renewal in IWAS in light of this decision, please let me know so we can open your document for you to receive those changes. Thanks for your patience on this matter.

As we prepare for this year's round of compliance visits for purposes of recognition, we have again delivered and recorded a **webinar to assist team leaders** in navigating this year's version of the evaluation instrument. This recorded webinar is posted to our website (see screen shot below), and schools scheduled to be visited may find it helpful to hear the instructions that we have given to the visiting teams.

Recall Notice Issued on Vegetable Products—On Oct. 19, Mann Packing of Salinas, Calif., voluntarily recalled some lots of minimally processed vegetable products because they may be contaminated with listeria monocytogenes. The recall has been expanded since that date to include additional product codes. Mann Packing is issuing this recall out of an abundance of caution. To date, public health officials have not reported any illnesses associated with these products. The recalled products were distributed throughout the United States and Canada with "best if used by" dates from Oct. 12 to Oct. 20 listed on the front of the packaging. Please contact your distributor or view the FDA recall notice in the link below for additional details about the affected lot codes.

Products provided through the USDA Department of Defense Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program are affected by this recall. Schools that received these products should have already

There is a new statute that provides for an Illinois tax credit for teachers who personally buy supplies for their classrooms that has come to my attention. Here's the text of the statute with some added highlight:

35 ILCS 5/225. Credit for Instructional Materials and Supplies.

For taxable years beginning on and after January 1, 2017, a taxpayer shall be allowed a credit in the amount paid by the taxpayer during the taxable year for instructional materials and supplies with respect to classroom based instruction in a qualified school, or \$250, whichever is less, provided that the taxpayer is a teacher, instructor, counselor, principal, or aide in a qualified school for at least 900 hours during a school year.

The credit may not be carried back and may not reduce the taxpayer's liability to less than zero. If the amount of the credit exceeds the tax liability for the year, the excess may be carried forward and applied to the tax liability of the 5 taxable years following the excess credit year. The tax credit shall be applied to the earliest year for which there is a tax liability. If there are credits for more than one year that are available to offset a liability, the earlier credit shall be applied first.

For purposes of this Section, the term "materials and supplies" means amounts paid for instructional materials or supplies that are designated for classroom use in any qualified school. For purposes of this Section, the term "qualified school" means a public school or non-public school located in Illinois.

This Section is exempt from the provisions of Section 250. (Source: P.A. 100-22, eff. 7-6-17.)

I understand that this credit is in addition to a comparable federal tax credit for which I have no statute citation but which is discussed at https://www.irs.gov/taxtopics/tc450/tc458. Don't ask me further about this as the next person to talk to would be a qualified tax professional.
